WHAT'S HAPPENING?

Three of the Callerlab QS committees have voted not to have any new QS movements for the first quarter of 1984. We think that was a wise idea. For many callers, the last quarter of 1983 was a busy time in that it was necessary to workshop a fairly large number of new experimentals if they wanted to keep their dancers current in the selections for that quarter. We tend to agree with the increasing number of callers who are suggesting that we find some way to stagger the QS selections.

On another note, we have recently read Don Beck's new book on mental image choreography. He calls it "Out of Sight" and we think it is very well done. While we continue to use and recommend sight calling as a primary calling method, we recognize that the mental image

method is used by many callers and for them Don's book (in our opinion) shapes up as the definitive text on the subject.

Lots of new moves crossed our desk this month, so we'll get right to them:

CHANGE THE SET UP (Des Hetherington)
From any formation with ends and centers,
Ends Trade as centers do a U-Turn Back.

CROSSFIRE TO A DIAMOND (Wayne Ball) Ends Trade as centers Cast 3/4 with inside hands. Ends in diamonds.

CROSS SCATTER SCOOT (Victor Ceder)
From parallel ocean waves, infacing dancers do a Cross Scoot Back as outfacing dancers Trade the wave. Right hand waves become left hand waves and vice versa.

FLIP THRU (Glen Maynard) From any wave or line, all Single (partner) Hinge Box (Split) Circulate, Single Hinge again and, without stopping, centers Trade.

The action always ends in an ocean wave.

MAKE A NEW WAVE (Jack Berg) From parallel lines or waves in which the centers form a mini-wave, Ends Circulate and face in as the centers Cast 3/4 and Extend. Ends in parallel ocean waves.

What's Happening? (continued)

RIDE THE LINE(Jim Cholmondeley) From parallel 2-faced lines, infacing couples do a 1/2 Circulate to forma momentary 2-faced line in the center. Without stopping, the (very) centers of this 2-faced line Trade and each of the center couples does another 1/2 Circulate. Simultaneously, the outfacing couples do a Standard Couples Circulate to end the action in parallel 2-faced lines. The author also provides the following variations:

RIDE THE DIAMOND: Ride the Line plus centers Hinge to end in twin diamonds.

RIDE THE HINGE: Ride the Line plus couples Hinge to end in a Tidal 2-faced line formation.

RUN THE TAG: From any line or wave, centers Run and without stopping, the new centers do a Partner Tag and take the facing command (in, out, right, left, etc.)

SHADOW TO AN HOURGLASS (Bill Harrison) From parallel 2-faced lines or waves, all dancers except the centers facing in do their part of Shadow to a Diamond. Infacing centers step ahead and, turning 1/4 toward the center, join inside hands with their counterpart from across the set to end in an hourglass formation.

SHAKE THE COLUMN (Jack Berg) From columns, No. I dancers Peel Off + Circulate as others column Circulate one place. Column leaders now Flip into adjacent column as those who Peeled Run around them to form an infacing pair. The other 4 Walk & Dodge to end the action in an 8-Chain Thru formation.

SOMETHING MORE (Jack Berg) From a line or wave, 3/4 Tag the Line. Those coming into the center Turn Thru as those facing out Turn Back and Courtesy Turn the one who did the Turn Thru to end in facing couples.

WALK TO A WAVE (Guy Poland)
From any Box Circulate foursome infacers/
Circulate + 1/4 In as outfacers Circulate
and do a Flip-like action to become centers of the end-up ocean wave. The outfacers action is like a Right Roll 3/4.

WALK TO A 2-FACED LINE: Walk to a Wave but centers Slither. WALK TO A DIAMOND: Infacers Circulate 1-1/2.

WITH MAGNETISM: An add-on call that applies to adjacent dancers. If adjacent dancer is of the opposite sex, face that dancer, if adjacent is the same sex, put your back to the adjacent dancer. (based on the fact that with magnets, opposites attract). With Reverse Magnetism is the reverse of the above.

NEW MOVEMENT (Experimental)

DIVI-UP (Lilith Kopman)

How To Do It:

From a 1/4 Tag formation, centers (partner) Hinge & Roll as the other 4 Divide and move up to become the ends of the final facing lines of 4 formation. It is possible to call Divi-Up from certain other formations, in which case it may not necessarily end in facing lines of four.

Impressions:

While the move had an easy teach when we workshopped it, we suspect that a caller can make it's choreography as easy — or as difficult—as he feels his dancers may enjoy. From a zero/normal 1/4 Tag formation, it produces very manageable zero lines which could go a long way toward making the move popular with Plus or even Mainstream dancers. Give it a try and see what you think.

MOVIN' DOWN THE MAINSTREAM

SAME SEX SLIDE THRUS

For many years now, note service editors, when featuring the call Slide Thru, have typically focused on using the call from both opposite-sex-facing and same-sex-facing alignments --- and we, of course, have often done the same. The obvious reason for this kind of approach to Slide Thru is that while we seldom note any problems when Slide Thru is called to facing dancers of the opposite sex, there is generally a very predictable amount of fallout when it is called to facing dancers of the same sex. And that's really a shame because, as we all know, the definition for Slide Thru allows the call to be done from both situations and it can, therefore, be used to provide a caller with a neat way to set up some interesting choreography.

We've always been fond of same-sex-facing-Slide Thrus and we use 'em quite often. To be sure, we usually find it necessary to begin by briefly reminding the dancers about the definition (i.e., after a Pass Thru, boys always turn 1/4 right and girls always turn 1/4 left). It is, on the other hand, also obvious that if we all did this a lot more, the aforementioned problem would quickly evaporate and the choreographic versatility of Slide Thru would be more readily available. Here are some ideas to use as drills:

- Right & Left Thru
 Rollaway, 1/2 Sashay
 Pass Thru.....(3B)
 All Slide Thru
 Ends Cross Fold
 Centers Box the Gnat
 Same 4 Square Thru 3/4AL!
- 1-3 Rollaway, 1/2 Sashay
 All Circle Left
 4 boys Slide Thru,

The routine that follows probably ought to be classified as a gimmick routine — although it is a good drill to

test whether the dancers really understand the definition of Slide Thru. We recommend calling it first exactly the way it is shown below...and then calling it again but instead of actually calling the 9 Slide Thrus consecutively (between the asterisks) call "Those who can Slide Thru nine times!" It's great fun for those who enjoy this kind of choreographic puzzle!

THE PLUS PROGRAM

TRIPLE TRADE

Triple Trade doesn't seem to be called as often as some of the other Plus moves and it can, therefore, serve as a useful theme-call for a Plus Workshop. Triple Trade is usually called from Tidal Ocean Waves or Tidal 2-Faced Lines, although it can also be called from Tidal (1-faced) Lines, Point-to-Point Diamonds and from certain other formations featuring identifiable 6-dancer waves, lines or columns. Check out the following routines:

MORE SINGING CALL THEMES

In last month's singing call feature, we described a concept in which each figure in a singing call began with the same choreography but ended differently. We'll expand on the idea this month by providing a variety of endings for the traditional singing call star figure:

Begin it this way (first 4 lines - 32 beats):

Head 2 Square Thru, 4 hands and go Meet the Sides make a Right Hand Star and turn it once you know Heads to the middle make a left hand star, turn it once around To the same 2, go Right & Left Thru, turn the girl and when you do

End it this way (last 4 lines - 32 beats)

- a) Dive Thru, Square Thru, 3/4s go Swing that corner lady boys, then you Promeno (add 16 beat tag)
- b) Swing Thru, Swing Thru again
 Swing that corner lady boys, Promenade my friend
 (add 16-beat tag)
- Swing Thru, Swing Thru again
 Boys Run, Promenade Promenade my friend
 (add 16-beat tag)
- d) Veer to the Left & Ferris Wheel and then the center two Pass Thru, that Corner Swing, Promenade you do (add 16-beat tag)

And sometimes, we'll also use the combination below in a singing call star theme:

e) (1st 2 lines as above -- then...

Heads to the middle make a left hand star turn it once and a half
All the way around to the other two and with those 2, Right & Left Thru
Pass Thru, Trade By, Swing that corner doll
Swing that corner lady, Promenade that hall
(add 16-beat Tag)

SIGHT CALLER'S NOTE BOOK (FORMATION MANAGEMENT SERIES)

Part 1. SETTING UP A 1/4 TAG FORMATION

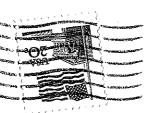
We promised in a recent issue that we would be inaugurating a Formation Management series that would be devoted to describing various ways for a caller to both establish and "normalize" some of the more common square dance formations. The intention of the series is to help callers learn how to avoid choreographic predictability and to thus improve their ability to develop and generate smooth and interesting traffic patterns while calling extemporaneously (i.e., while sight calling).

Since this is the first issue of the new year, it seems logical for us to begin and, for openers, we have selected the zero or normal 1/4 Tag formation as our spotlight formation/arrangement. We picked this formation because it ties in with this month's featured experimental (Divi-Up, see page 1521) which proceeds from a 1/4 Tag formation.

To Establish a Zero 1/4 Tag Formation (ØQ):

WHAT'S HAPPENING?

This month's featured move (Ping to a Diamond) poses an interesting -- and by no means uncommon -- dilemma for a note service editor. It seems that the name has been used before for a totally different call. When an author sends us a new call and we find that the name is already in the Encyclopedia, we generally notify the author and he (or she) will either change the name or ask us to report it "as is" -- in which case we will also report that the name has been used before. No one, however, sent us Ping to a Diamond. We saw it used at a major square dance event and were impressed by the very positive reaction that the dancers gave it. The dilemma arose when we learned that the name was already listed in Burleson's Encyclopedia (No. 3279). In this instance we decided to print it anyhow. To our knowledge, the earlier version never saw a lot of action and, in our opinion, the action of the earlier call is not as effective as the current version. Also, the name "Ping to a Diamond" fits the action of the current move far more appropriately than the original versian. As always, we welcome your comments. Here's the rest of the new stuff:

CHASE & WHEEL (Dave Wilson): From lines of 4 facing out, right side couples start a Chase Right but complete the action in the center of the set. This forms a 4-dancer wave in the center. The left side couples, meanwhile, do a Wheel & Deal to end the action in a 1/4 Tag formation.

CHASE & ANYTHING (Dave Wilson) Same as above except that left side couples take the "anything" call (1/2 Tag, Turn & Deal, etc.)

CROSS FLIP THE DIAMOND (Ron Meisl): From a normal (zero) diamond, centers Diamond Circulate as points "Cross-Flip" (Flip into the far center spot. Trailing Diamonds produce 2-faced lines and facing diamonds end in ocean waves.

MOVE ON & ANYTHING (Bill Worley) From columns, all do a Grand Walk & Dodge (leaders Dodge, all others Walk). Without stopping, outfacers Cloverleaf as other 4 take the anything call (Trade, Walk & Dodge, Scoot Back, etc.)

What's Happening? (continued)

POWERHOUSE (Gus Greene) From parallel 2-faced lines or some 3x1 lines, ends Circulate 1-1/2 as centers Cast 3/4. The very center 2 in the new wave Trade and all wave dancers (could be 4, 6 or 8 depending on the starting formation) individually face the center of that wave. If a number is added to the call (1 thru 8), the single file dancers do like a Tag for the indicated number of places.

RIPPLE THE BOAT (Jerry Rash): From facing lines of four, ends Ripple and without stopping, Circulate or Trade to the other end of the line where they will Ripple-In with the one they meet from the other side. Simultaneously, the centers of the line Ripple-Out+Partner Trade+Ripple to end the action in an 8-Chain Thru formation.

STRAIGHTAWAY: From a 1/4 Tag formation, wave ends Extend the Tag to the near outside dancer and those 2 Recycle (Release Recycle). Wave centers, meanwhile, Run to the vacated adjacent end position as the other outside dancers (those who didn't Recycle) Extend the Tag to the center line. The action ends in a 1/4 Line formation (2-faced line between facing pairs).

GREMLIN DEPT.

Several of you wrote in to point out that the Slide Thru 9x routine we published last month (the last routine on page 1525) did not work....for which we apologize. Our typist (me!) inadvertently omitted 3 lines and it also slipped through the final proofing. To correct it, change the first Wheel & Deal (line 5) to WD&Spread and then add "Pass Thru, U-Turn Back, Pass Thru, Wheel & Deal" before calling four Boys Swing Thru (line 6). That should get it!

SHARE THE WEALTH

Subscriber Jerry Ewert sent in this singing call routine using our last month's featured move (Divi-Up):

Heads Promenade 1/2 way, 1/2 way you go Down the Middle Pass the Ocean Divi-Up go 2 by 2 and when you're there RL Thru, Turn that lady fair Pass Thru, Bend the Line, go forward up & back

Square Thru 3 hands, Swing the Corner Promenade ...add 16-beat Tag.

NEW MOVEMENT (Experimental)

PING TO A DIAMOND

How To Do It:

From any 1/4 Tag formation, wave dancers Extend Twice, i.e., they Step Thru and Pass Thru with the outsides, and, without stopping, they individually face right to become points of the final diamond formation. Simultaneously, the outside pairs do their part of a Ping Pong Circulate (Pass Thru with the Extending centers and Step to a Wave). The action ends in center-to-center trailing diamonds.

Impressions:

The move is easily taught and easy to dance and the dancer response has been terrific! And this is why — in spite of the use of the name for a totally different action (see our comments in this month's "What's Happening" section) — we have decided to report it. Module callers may have a bit of difficulty in coming up with zeros that are relatively short and easy to memorize. But all of this notwithstanding, the fact remains that whenever we've seen it used — or used it ourselves — the dancer reaction has been excellent.

MOVIN' DOWN THE MAINSTREAM

WORKING WITH FAN THE TOP

Fan the Top continues to be one of the less-frequently called moves on the Mainstream List. This means that most dancers still respond to the call in an unsure and hesitant manner — and this, of course, makes it an excellent subject for a Mainstream theme tip (And it probably wouldn't hurt most Plus dancers either!).

From a teaching standpoint, dancers will usually need to be trained to always begin the centers action (when the move is called from right-hand ocean waves) with their left hands and to resist the temptation to turn someone with their right hands. Callers also need to be careful that they do not subject the centers to too much overflow. Such combinations as Swing Thru + Fan the Top or Spin Chain Thru + Fan the Top could easily make the centers dizzy and disoriented.

While the definition for Peel the Top permits the call from both a Z formation and from parallel mini-waves (a Box Circulate foursome), it is probably most-often called from the "Z". We'll explore the call this month from both of it's starting formations. If you haven't used it from parallel mini-waves before, it is important to remember that one uses the same definition for either one — just think of a "Z" as a kind of offset Box Circulate foursome.

Last month we inaugurated this series with a look at the most frequently used 1/4 Tag arrangement, the "Zero" or "normal" version (ØQ). WHAT'S HAPPENING?

With this issue we begin our thirteenth year of Choreo Breakdown and, as we always do in our annual birthday issue, we need to once again thank all our subscribers for making it possible. We appreciate your support and we are very grateful for the way you have accepted our efforts. Again, many many thanks!

Load the Top (see page 1512, Dec. 1983) seems to be gaining more andmore popularity and it is now seeing a lot of action on the workshop circuit. Our emphasis move this month is Lee Kopman's "Straightaway". We

listed it in the What's Happening? section last month — but we've decided to feature it this month because we like it's ability to provide dancing experience in the seldom-used 1/4 Line formation.

Here's the other material we examined this month:

ACT THE DIAMOND (Gene Knutson) From parallel diamonds, point dancers Circulate 1-1/2 places around the outside as wave dancers Trade the Wave (momentary 6-hand OW with 2 flankers; also 3 Motivate stars). Center star (4 dancers) turn 1/4 (Or more if so directed) as outside 2-dancer stars Trade. The perimeter four move up as the other 4 Cast Off 3/4 to end the action in parallel waves.

ALTER THE HOURGLASS (Victor Ceder). From an Hourglass formation, all Hourglass Circulate Double, then Flip the Hourglass. Without stopping, centers Cast Off 3/4 as ends turn back.

Alter the Galaxy All Double Galaxy Circulate; Flip the Galaxy; centers star 3/4, ends turn back.

CIRCLE TO A DIAMOND: (Victor Ceder): From facing couples: Circle left 1/4; beaus Box Circulate 1-1/2 as belles Dodge and Extend to end in diamonds. It is also possible to Circle 1/2 or 3/4 to a diamond; also Reverse Circle to a Diamond (circle left 1/4 and continue as above).

What's Happening? (continued)

CROSSOVER AND FLIP (Al Appleton) From parallel lines or waves, all Crossover Circulate, centers Hinge and without stopping, all Flip the Diamond to end in waves.

DISPERSE (Lee Kopman) From columns, No. I and No. 4 dancers in the same column (working with each other) do a 1/2 Zoom and then Hinge. Simultaneously, No. 2 and 3 column dancers (centers) Walk & Dodge and individually face right (Box Counter Rotate) and without stopping, Trade and Spread. Original I and 4 dancers (phantom) Column Circulate to become centers of the final parallel waves formation.

EXPLODE IT (Ed Curran) From a 1/4 Tag formation, Wave dancers Explode the Wave as outside face each other and right pull by (momentary lines facing out). Ends now Fold to end the action in an 8-Chain Thru.

FLARE OUT TO A LINE (Lee Kopman) From parallel 2-faced lines (or Promenade), leaders or those designated turn away (out), step ahead and then turn 1/4 again in the same direction (a Turn & Deal type action). All now move up to end in a Tidal 2-faced line formation.

FOUR BY FOUR RIPPLE (Jack Berg) Facing couples Circle 1/2 and Pass Thru.

HINGE AND PEEK (Johnny Hayes, England) From a variety of formation (lines, 2-faced lines, inverted lines, 3x1 lines, diamonds) All Hinge (partner or single) and, without stopping, outfacers (Peek) and Trade places.

LEVITATE (Bruce Busch) From columns centers Trade & Spread (Squeeze) and then Zing as others do a Vertical 1/2 Tag and then 1/4 Thru to end the action in a 1/4 Tag formation.

LINE THE WAVE (Nonie Moglia) From parallel ocean waves, All 8 Circulate but ends go double as centers Trade and U-Turn Back to end in parallel 2-faced lines

INS/OUTS CONCEPT (Richard Dinkel)
Infacers or outfacers (as directed) do the
designated action as others Circulate, e.g.,
Ins Cross Over Circulate, etc.

PING THEDIAMOND (Don Beck) From parallel diamonds, points diamond Circulate as wave dancers Ping Pong Circulate to end in a 1/4 Tag formation.

PING TO A RIPPLE (Nonie Moglia) From a 1/4 Tag formation, centers step ahead and joins both hands with their opposite outside dancer. Without stopping, all Ripple as directed (in, out, etc.)

STIMULATE(nonie Moglia) From parallel 2-facedlines, all Couples Circulate but ends go double. Centers Trade and do a U-Turn Back to end in parallel ocean waves.

TURN THE CORNER (John Saunders) From a Double Pass Thru formation, all Extend the Tag twice (centers Pass Thru + Step to a Wave with the outsides); all now Single Hinge and without stopping, all again Extend the Tag Twice to end in a completed Double Pass Thru formation. The call allows an amplifier (face right, left, in, out, etc. If the call is Turn the Corner Ix1 or Ix2 er 2x1, etc., the first number refers to the number of Extends before the Hinge and the second number identified the number of Extends after the Hinge.

NEW MOVEMENT (Experimental)

STRAIGHT AWAY (Lee Kopman)

How To Do It:

From a 1/4 Tag or 1/4 Line Formation, the ends of the center wave or line Extend to form a momentary mini-wave with the outside belle (right-side) dancer and, without stopping, each mini-wave then does a Recycle to end as the outsides of the final formation. Simultaneously, the centers of the inside wave or line Flip or (phantom) Run into the adjacent vacated end position as the outside beaus (left-side)dancers) Extend into the center to become the (very) centers of the final formation. 1/4 Tag formations become 1/4 Line formations and vice versa. (right-hand center waves produce left-facing center 2-faced lines; right-facing center 2-faced lines produce left-hand center waves, etc.) The author also provides the following definition for an obvious spin-off:

CROSS STRAIGHTAWAY: Same action as above except that the outside beaus "cross" into the other (furthest) very center position. (right-facing center 2-faced lines produce right-hand ocean waves in the center and vice versa).

Impressions:

While we've usually liked most of the experimentals whose actions have featured a "Long" Recycle, we feel that this one has a slight drawback: if you want to end the action in a normal or "zero" arrangement, you have to begin it in an un-normal or non-zero arrangement—and if you begin it from a normal arrangement, it ends in an other-than-normal set up. Such calls are sometimes useful in a one-shot festival workshop, but they seldom become very popular elsewhere, which is why we usually do not feature them in these pages. We've made an exception in this case, however, because the call offers a fairly easy way for a caller to explore the seldom-called 1/4 Line formation and this, we feel, is a definite plus. Also, the Cross Straight Away variation neatly avoids these drawbacks and it might well gain some dancer acceptance. The teach is relatively easy and we think you might want to give this move a look-see.

SINGING CALL (Corner Progression)

MOVIN' DOWN THE MAINSTREAM

FACING CIRCULATES

The official definition of the call "Circulate" is cited as a "General Rule" and it states that the directed (active) dancers must move forward along the designated Circulate path to the next position. It is important to note that the definition does not require the Circulators to all be facing in the same direction along their Circulate path. This means that it is possible (legal) to have opposite-facing Circulators pass each other as they move forward along the appropriate Circulate path. (While most of the time Passing Circulators will pass with right shoulders, the Callerlab passing rule should always be applied.)

The significance of all this is that it is thus possible for a caller to call a Circulate from formations that most dancers will usually not associate with the call. From facing lines of 4, for example, a Circulate is exactly the same as a Pass Thru. It is also equal to a Pass Thru when it is called from an 8-Chain Thru formation (think of an 8-Chain Thru as facing side-by-side columns). From a Trade By formation, a Circulate is the same as a Trade By.

Undoubtedly, the average Mainstream dancer will require a lot of additional training and instruction in this aspect of Circulate, but the concept can produce some very interesting choreography and it can certainly be used as the theme for an interesting Mainstream workshop. Here are some ideas:

CHASE RIGHT

Would you agree with our assessment that — for some reason — Plus dancers seem to be losing their ability to do a Chase Right? We don't know why, but we've noticed more fallout than usual whenever we call a Chase Right these days — especially when we call it from some arrangement other than normal lines facing out — and we wonder if you've had the same experience? Could be time for some concentrated Chase Right drills — and maybe even a look at Chase Left! Try these on for size:

SIGHT CALLER'S NOTE BOOK (FORMATION MANAGEMENT SERIES)

Part 3. SETTING UP ZERO COLUMNS (ØC)

The most common way for a caller to establish any of the six column arrangements that we can establish with symmetric choreography, is for him to first set-up the appropriate facing lines of 4 arrangement and to then call Touch 1/4. The operating principle here is that from any Callerlab designated facing lines arrangement, a Touch 1/4 will always produce right-facing columns with the same Callerlab designation: A zero line plus Touch 1/4 produces a zero column (ØC); a half-sashayed line (1/2L) produces a 1/2 column (1/2C); a No. 1 line (1L) produces a No. 1 column; and so on.

When most callers, these days, want to establish a zero column (OC) they will generally first establish a zero line and then call Touch 1/4. Thus:

To Set-Up a Zero Column (ØC):

From a Zero Line (ØL) :	Call Tauch 1/4 (ØC)
From a Zero Box (ØB):	Call Slide Thru, Touch 1/4 (ØC)
From Zero Ocean Waves (ØW):	Call Recycle, Slide Thru, Touch 1/4 (ØC)
From a Zero Double Pass Thru Formation (ØP):	Call Centers Pass Thru, All Slide Thru, Touch 1/4 (ØC)

As noted, the above column get-ins represent the standard and the most common ways for a caller to establish zero columns. It is also useful, however, for a sight caller to be able to set up columns in a way that the dancers will regard as slightly different and (hopefully!) unexpected. With this is mind, note the following:

Formation Management - Columns (continued):

SETTING UP A 1/2 COLUMN (1/2C)

The simplest way to establish a 1/2 Column is to call a Column Circulate from a zero column (From zero columns, each successive call to Circulate will serve to alternate the arrangement between a zero column and a 1/2 column). A caller will, however, often prefer to get into a 1/2 column without an immediately preceding Column Circulate — in which case:

WHAT'S HAPPENING?

As we write this, the annual Callerlab convention is just around the corner and we're preparing to once again participate in all of it's exciting activities and events. We've attended each and every convention so far and we've always returned home feeling great about the opportunity to meet and talk and exchange ideas with callers from all over the world. As usual, there are a number of important issues to be voted upon at this year's convention and we'll

be reporting on them next month. And for those of you who are also going to Chicago this month, be sure to look us up and say "Hi". We'll be moderating a session on the Business Side of Calling as well as chairing 3 sessions of the Caller Training Committee.

Most of you are probably aware by now that Callerlab's MSQS Committee has chosen to select no new moves for the second quarter of 1984. The Plus QS Committee, however, has announced that "Chase the Tag" is the new QS Move for the Plus Program for the same period and we've provided some material on page 1554.

We received very few new calls for review this month and we have therefore decided to omit a featured experimental this month. Here, however, are the new ideas that did cross our desk this past month:

BACK OFF (Paul McNutt) From single file columns, the No. 1 and 3 column dancers Zoom into the place behind them as the No. 2 and 4 column dancers Dodge (Slide sideways) into the place vacated by the adjacent Zoomer. Called from a zero column formation, Back Off ends in a 1/2 Sashayed 8-Chain Thru formation.

MAGIC SPLIT TRANSFER (Richard Dinkel) From Magic Columns, outfacers in each Box Cast Back 3/4 (Single Shakedown) to face in Infacers, Magic Circulate 1/2 to

right hand holds and Cast 3/4, then Extend to meet the outside dancers and end the action in parallel right hand OWs.

RELAY THE REACTION (Fred Biven) From parallel RH OWs, all swing right 1/2, centers swing left 3/4 as ends Circulate 1/2 (momentary 6-hand OW with 2 flankers). Now the 2 very centers Trade as the flankers Slide sideways to form a 4-hand RH star. The star turns 1/4 as the other 4 Trade. Those who meet with left hands Cast left 3/4 and all others move up to end the action in parallel RH waves. Called from LH OWs, the action is the same except opposite hands are used throughout.

SLANT / LEFT SLANT (Charley Muff) From facing pairs, right side dancer (belle) moves forward and to the left to end in front of the left side dancer (beau). All remain facing the same direction and all adjust to form the appropriate end-up formation. Facing lines produce parallel ocean waves, 8-Chain Thru produces columns, etc. The action is reversed if the call is Left Slant (beau moves in front of belle).

TAG THE LINE - INVERT/OUTVERT (Don Beck) From any formation that allows a Tag the Line, all Tag the Line and leaders face in as trailers face out (Tag the Line-Invert) to end in an inverted Line. If the call is Tag the Line -Outvert, leaders face out and trailers face in. 1/2 Tag the Line Invert ends in a Magic Column.

NEW PLUS QUARTERLY

CHASE THE TAG (Right-Left-etc.)

Callerlab's Plus QS Committee has announced the selection of a new QS move for Plus Program dancers in the second quarter of 1984: Chase the Tag (Right, Left, In, Out). Here's the definition:

CHASE THE TAG:

From back-to-back pairs, right-side dancers (belles) do a right-face U-Turn Back as the left-side dancers (beaus) Fold to produce a momentary Double Pass Thru formation. All now finish as in a Tag the Line and all then take a command to face i one is given. Fractional variation include Chase the 1/2 Tag, Chase the 3/4 Tag, etc. From a zero/normal line + Pass Thru, Chase the Tag produces a completed Double Pass Thru formation with girls as leaders and boys as trailers.

SPLIT PING PONG CIRCULATE

The concept of "splitting" a Ping Pong Circulate has apparently been kicking around for some time — although we hadn't heard about it until just recently. The idea is interesting — but no "biggie" and we suspect it's greatest value might be as a filler at a festival—type Plus work—shop. We pass it along for your interest and consideration.

The action of a Split Ping Pong Circulate is identical to a standard Ping Pong Circulate except that when the wave dancers reach the outsides, they do not do a Partner Trade but do a U-Turn Back (toward the center) instead. When it is called from a zero or "normal" 1/4 Tag formation, a Split Ping Pong Circulate ends in another 1/4 Tag formation with the centers normal and the outsides 1/2 Sashayed. Here are some sample routines:

A Triple Star Thru can also be called from a normal/zero 8-Chain Thru arrangement, in which case only those coming into the center after the second Star Thru can do the third (triple) Star Thru. 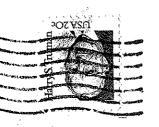
Part 4: SETTING UP 8-CHAIN THRU ARRANGEMENTS

Most callers find that they are easily able to set up both zero (normal) 8-Chain Thru arrangements and 8-Chain Thru arrangements that are 1/2 Sashayed, so we'll concentrate on some of the other 8-Chain Thru arrangements that a sight caller's programming requirements will often require him to establish. This month, we'll work on the so-called same-sex boxes: the No. 1 Box (boys outside/girls inside) and then the No. 2 Box (girls outside/boys inside).

We had a great time in Chicago at the 1984 Callerlab Convention — and everyone we talked to who was there seems to agree. The meetings were well-planned, carefully organized, and they were carried on in a highly professional manner. Now that it is over, the impression that seems to have remained with us the longest is that this convention clearly demonstrates how well the system seems to be working. All of Callerlab's many committees have been active during the year and they have been

making excellent progress. We were especially impressed with the efficient way in which the final Wednesday morning wrap-up meeting was conducted (that's the one where the membership finally gets to vote). See our report on page 1568 for all the details.

In the New Ideas Dept., these are the new moves we looked at this past month:

CUP CAKE (Jim Harlow) From a 1/4 Tag formation, wave dancers Hinge + Walk & Dodge + Cloverleaf as the other four Extend to end the action in another 1/4 Tag formation.

MIX & MATCH (Ross Howell) From form-having identifiable centers and outsides (or ends), the outsiders do the first portion of the first-named call as the centers do first portion of the second-named call. Then, when all dancers have "matched" their formation, all finish their call together. Calls selected to Mix & Match must all finish the same way.

PIECE OF CAKE (Jim Harlow) From a 1/4 Tag formation, the centers Explode the Wave + Cloverleaf as the outsiders Extend to end the action in another 1/4 Tag formation. (Note: the name has been used previously).

What's Happening? (continued)

SINGLE FILE RECYCLE: From facing tandems (single file columns of two) leaders
Touch + Backtrack as trailers Veer left and forward to become ends of the final ocean wave.

SIX BITS CIRCULATE (Jack Berg) From parallel lines or waves, all 3/4 Tag the Line-Right. Centers now Single Circle to a wave as ends Circulate to end in parallel 2-faced lines. Six Bits & Anything involves the same action for the centers but ends take the "anything" call...unless the caller designates the dancers who take the "anything" call.

SLINK (Jack Berg) From an OW, all 1/2 Slide to form facing couples. Slink Away means to do a Slink and then turn 1/4 in the direction of the handedness of the original wave.

STRAIGHT FIRE: From parallel 2-faced lines, centers and outfacing ends do a Cross-fire as infacing ends walk forward and Veer in to become No. 2 dancers in the final columns formation.

SWING & SPIN THE DEUCEY (Doug Rieck) From parallel ocean waves (or from an 8-Chain Thru formation) all Turn 1/2 right, new centers turn left 3/4 as the ends 1/2 Circulate. Those in the 6-hand wave then turn 1/2 right and all who can turn left 3/4. Without stopping, the others then 1/2 Circulate or step forward to form parallel waves. From here — still without stopping — all repeat the entire action one more time.

CHOREO SYMBOLS

In the line set-ups shown last month, all boys had the same girl (partner, corner, opposite or RH lady) as partners. In the lines below, end boys have one girl while the center boys have another:

FACING LINES OF FOUR

Symbol	Set-Up and Get-In
EPL	Men in sequence; end men with partner-center men with opposite as in Side ladies Chain, 1–3 Lead Right, Circle to a line

NEW MOVEMENT (Experimental)

SCOOT AND MIX (Jerry Rash)

How To Do It:

From right-facing 2-faced lines and left-hand ocean waves, infacing centers begin a Scoot Back action, i.e., they step ahead and after turning each other 1/2 by the right, they Veer left and forward to become an outfacing end of the final formation. Simultaneously, the outfacing centers Cross Run to become the infacing ends. The original ends, meanwhile, Slide together and Trade. 2-faced lines end in 2-faced lines; LH waves become RH waves. Left Scoot & Mix starts from left-facing 2-faced lines and RH ocean waves. The action is the same as above except that Scooters turn 1/2 Left and Veer Right.

Impressions:

The action for this call is obviously inspired by calls on the Advanced Program List (Scoot and...and Mix). The traffic pattern, however, is simple, smooth-flowing and easily taught and we see no problem in using the call (as an experimental) at the Plus program. Give it a try and see what you think!

MOVIN' DOWN THE MAINSTREAM

LEFTY 2-FACED LINES

The oft-noted distaste that many Mainstream dancers display for left-handed choreography probably derives from the fact: that a lot of Mainstream callers rarely program such material and, on the rare occasions when they do, they tend to make their routines inordinately difficult. The trick, of course, is to make it easy for the dancers to do the calls they already know from infrequently encountered left-hand formations and to be especially careful that the unfame. iliar left-hand patterns are made to flow smoothly, logically and without interruption. The routines below feature parallel left-facing 2-faced lines. Note the several ways in " which that formation is established:

And while their arguments often sound reasonable, it seem to us that the elimination of the QS programs would do away with the only really valid way we now have to screen and evaluate promising new moves to see if they can withstand the test of time. Witness the recent addition of Linear Cycle to the Plus Program (see page 1568). Here are some review figures in case you may want to refresh your dancers¹ memory:

FOR THE A 1/A2 CALLER

SPIN THE WINDMILL VARIATIONS

Spin the Windmill is one of the most versatile calls on the A2 List. It's versatility is in large measure due to the fact that the outsides can be directed to face right, left, in or out before starting their action and this can be used to create a wide range of end-up formations. Another factor that contributes to it's versatility, however, is the fact that it can be called from a variety of starting formations. While it is most usually called from DPT, Trade By, 1/4 Tag or 3/4 Tag arrangements, it can also be called from a number of other -- and often unexpected -- formations. Note the following ideas:

1984 CALLERLAB CONVENTION

As most of you no doubt know by now, the 1984 Callerlab convention was recently held in Chicago and, as usual, we found it to be an educational, enlightening, and thoroughly uplifting experience. It was also great fun! We have always, at previous conventions, been impressed by the good fellowship and professional cameraderie that is typically displayed by the working callers who attend each year's meetings and it seemed, to us at least, to be even more evident in Chicago this year.

Many significant actions were taken at the 1984 convention including a thorough review of the Callerlab dance programs. It is our impression that instead of merely juggling the calls on the various programs, this year's actions seem to reflect a serious effort to impart a sense of purpose and permanence to the lists while still allowing them to carefully incorporate the changes that time and custom may require. Here is a brief rundown of some of the more significant actions taken at this year's Wednesday morning wrap-up meeting:

Mainstream Committee:

- 1. Substitute (42b) and Touch (46c) were deleted from the Mainstream List. The effect of this is to eliminate the "Family" designations while retaining the single calls Zoom and Touch 1/4.
- 2. The definition of Backtrack (13b) was changed to allow only a Single File Backtrack (Couples Backtrack is now no longer a part of the definition).
- 3. For a one year trial basis, the call Courtesy Turn (15) as used in the Basic and Mainstream programs, shall be limited to a boy turning a girl only.
- 4. The Basic and Mainstream programs, as now amended, were, in effect, frozen for a period of four years. This means that with the exception of MSQS calls that meet the appropriate criteria, no new calls may be added or deleted from those lists until Callerlab's 1988 convention.

Mainstream QS Committee:

This committee did some major housecleaning. It deleted Divide to a Column, Ripple, Dixie Derby and Red Hot from the MSQS list. Linear Cycle was also deleted but it was picked up by the Plus Committee (see below). The membership specifically voted to retain Chain Down the Line and Grand Spin on the MSQS List.

Plus Committee:

Linear_Cycle was added to the Plus Liist. It was placed between Teacup Chain and Ping Pong irculate on the Plus Teaching Order.

Plus QS Committee:

Track and Anything and Mix to a Diamond were removed from the Plus QS List. The membership specifically approved the retention of Spin Chain and Exchange the Gears and Grand Spin.

Callerlab Convention (continued)

Advanced Committee: The recommendation of the Advanced Committee was to formally adopt the Advanced definitions (which had been used on a 1-year trial basis during the past 12 months). The membership approved the committee's recommendation except for those portions of the definitions that pertain to the definition of the term "Partner". As the result of another motion, this question has been referred to the Board of Governors who has been charged with the responsibility for reviewing the question and making recommendations for it's resolution by the 1985 convention. It was also decided that the Advanced Program be divided into two categories — an A1 and an A2 program — but this does not require that a distinct A1 program be established where it is not needed.

Program Coordinating Committee: Several significant actions were taken:

- 1. Quarterly Selections in each program are now limited to no more than one call in any quarter (No Selection, however, remains as an available option).
- 2. To minimize some obvious problems, the selected QS calls for each program will now be released on a staggered basis, as follows:

MSQS

For the quarters beginning in January, April and October (no release in July)

Plus QS

For the quarters beginning in February, May, August and November For the quarters beginning in March, June, September and December.

Miscellaneous: A number of additional committee actions were also approved: Several Glossary changes were adopted as were recommendations of the Timing, Styling and Formations committees. The period of initial acceditation by Callerlab was changed from 5 years to 6 years.

WHAT'S HAPPENING?

What's Happening? Not much of anything! For the first time since we began these notes more than twelve years ago, we have no new experimental moves to report. Next month's issue will probably be about a week late. We'll be off to Australia at the end of June for our second time around and we're scheduled to call dances and conduct caller schools in Sydney, Canberra, Melbourne and Perth. As you can imagine, Betty and I are both looking forward to the trip and, as usual, we'll have a detailed report on our "Down Under" experience in our next issue.

NEW MOVEMENT (Experimental)

LOAD THE WINDMILL

How To Do It:

From facing lines of four, the end dancers start to do the ends' action of a Load the Boat, i.e., they Circulate two places around the outside of the set and, when they meet the third dancer, they Touch 1/4 to become ends (leader/trailer) of the final columns formation. Simultaneously, the center four do a Swing Thru and, without stopping, Cast 3/4 by the right to end as column centers.

Impressions:

The action of this call combines the ends' part of a Load the Boat with the centers part of the A2 call Spin the Windmill and, despite the fact that part of the call has it's roots in the Advanced program, we've noted an excellent dancer response when we've used it in a workshop for Plus Program dancers. The call strikes us an excellent choice for a summer workshop series (square dance camp, week-end or festival workshop) and if you're in the market to use an experimental in that kind of program we tout this one very highly. It might be just the thing you've been looking for.

MOVIN' DOWN THE MAINSTREAM

WORKING WITH LEFTY COLUMNS

Last December we featured column choreography in our Mainstream section (see page 1515). Our focus at that time was on more or less standard and familiar r-ght-hand column routines. One seldom sees very many routines that feature left-hand columns -- probably because thay re not all that easy to set up, and, for this reason, we felt that it might be appropriate to shine this month's MS spotlight on some left-handed column variations. Be sure, however, that you handle 'em with a certain amount of caution. Bear in mind that most dancers rarely encounter a lefty column formation and will usually find such an arrangement to be a bit strange and unusual. Good luck!

TRADE THE WAVE

Trade the Wave is an interesting call because it's major effect is to "trade" just about everything -- right hand waves become left-handed (and vice versa); ends become centers; centers become ends. Most Plus dancers seem able to handle the call easily, providing it is called from zero/normal left-hand waves. They have a bit more difficulty however if it is called from right-hand waves -- unless the very next call is an Allemande Left! This would seem to make Trade the Wave a pretty good candidate for the theme of a tip in a summer workshop program. Here are some workshop drills:

STILL MORE SINGING CALL THEMES

Last December (page 1517) and again in January (page 1527) we published some material in which we featured a concept involving theme-oriented singing calls. We've had a lot of very positive comments about those articles so we thought we'd publish some more material along the same lines. You will recall that the idea in such routines is to begin each singing call figure in the exact same way, but to then deliberately change the way in which the final partner change occurs. Here's another batch of singing call routines with a common beginning sequence but with an entirely different ending:

Start out each routine by calling:

Head two go Right & Left Thru, turn the girl I say Cross Trail Thru & go 'round one, make a line of 4 that way

...and from there you may use any, some -- or all -- of the following ideas to complete the figure with a Corner progression partner change:

- Go up & back & Star Thru, Dive Thru & then Square Thru 3/4 round to the Corner girl my friend Allemande Left that Corner, partner Dosado Go back, swing the corner Promenade (add 16-beat tag)
- Everybody go Right & Left Thru, turn that lady fair Slide Thru, Touch 1/4, Follow Your Neighbor there Allemande Left the Corner, partner Dosado Go back, Swing the corner, Promenade (add 16-beat tag)
- 3. Right & Left Thru, turn the girl, Flutterwheel I say Pass the Ocean, Recycle, 2 by 2 that way Allemande Left the corner, Partner Dosado Go back, Swing the Corner, Promenade (add 16-beat tag)
- 4.Go up and back & Square Thru, count 4 hands around
 When you're done Trade By, go walkin' cross the town
 Pass Thru, Trade By again & find the corner girl
 Swing that corner round and round, Promenade that world
 (add 16-beat tag)
- 5. Pass the Ocean, girls Trade, Swing Thru & then

SIGHT CALLER'S NOTEBOOK

A STRUCTURED "SNAPSHOT" RESOLUTION FORMULA

Many resolution formulas have been developed over the years that make it possible for a sight caller to resolve the set and it has been our custom to describe them in the Sight Caller's Notebook whenever we learn about a new one. We recently ran across an interesting resolution procedure that is based on a caller's ability to recognize that none of the key couples are paired with their original partners. This would seem to combine a bit of "Snapshot" Sight with a more or less traditionally structured resolution formula and we therefore present it here for your interest.

It should be noted at the outset, however, that this method is not for beginning sight callers. It proceeds on the assumption that the caller is an experienced sight caller who will easily be able to resolve the set from any facing lines set-up in which it is seen (snapshot) that at least one of the key couples is paired. In that situation, one of two conditions will exist: (assume normal/zero lines)

- A. Both couples Paired: This means that the dancers are either in a Zero Line (ZL/1P2P) or in a ZL-os and an experienced sight caller will easily be able to get-out from either set-up.
- B. One Couple Paired/One Couple Unpaired: The standard resolution procedure in this case would be to:
 - a. Check to see if the paired couple is on the left end of the line. If not, call a Right & Left Thru to place them there.
 - b. Call Pass Thru + Wheel & Deal and the centers will then be either a Pass Thru or a Square Thru 3/4 away from an accurate Allemande Left.

As we have indicated, most experienced sight callers are already aware of the above methodology and it, by itself, is not the subject of this article. The focus of this article is to explore what a sight caller might do if it is found (snapshot) that none of the facing lines couples are paired. With symmetric choreography, the dancers may then be in one of ten different set-ups (CL, CL-os, OL, OL-os, RL, RL-os, ECL, ECL-os, Erl, ERL-os) and, in any one of them, the following procedure may be followed to produce an accurate resolution:

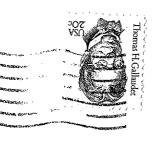
1. <u>Call 2 ladies Chain (RL Thru+Flutterwheel)</u>: Now check to see if any one has been paired. In 6 of the ten possible unpaired set-ups, a ladies Chain will pair up one of the couples and a caller may then proceed as in step B above.

If, however, all couples are still unpaired, a caller may assume that the dancers are in one of four possible set-ups as noted below:

- a) Men in sequence, all with opposites (OL)
- b) Men out of sequence, all with opposites (OL-os)
- c) Men out of sequence, end men with corner; center men with right-hand lady (ECL-os)
- d) Men in sequence, end men with right-hand lady, center men with corner (ERL)

If the dancers are now in any one of the four above-described unpaired set-ups, proceed to step (b) below. It is not necessary to identify which of the four the dancers are in, merely that they are unpaired.

Call: Pass the Ocean, Swing Thru
 8 Circulate, girls go double
 Boys Run, Bend the Line

This routine will, in two of the four set-ups (OL and OL-os) pair up one couple. If the couples are still unpaired, call 2 ladies Chain and this will pair up one of the couples and, in either case, a caller may then proceed to resolve the set as in step B above.

Actually, the above-described resolution method is not nearly as complicated as it sounds. It is, however, necessary for a caller who uses this method to be able to to quickly snapshot partner pairings — or, more correctly, the absence of partner pairings — but this should not be a problem for an experienced sight caller. We have a hunch that many sight callers are already doing this — or something very similar to it — but if you haven't tried it before, have a go at it and see how you like it. It could turn out to be one more tool in your sight calling bag of tricks.

Sorry we're a bit late this month. Blame it on our recent rip to Australia. It was a great trip and we've described some of the highlights on page 1586. We are, however, getting over our jet lag and seem to be back into the swing of things. We'll be back to our usual schedule next month.

No doubt many of you are already aware that Load the Top has been chosen as the Quarterly Selection for the Plus Program for the quarter beginning August first. It is, we think, an excellent choice and we plan to give it another look-see in the August issue. In the meantime, however, you might want to refresh your memory by reviewing our earlier

Load the Top feature (see page 1512).

The following experimentals were among those in our mailbag when we returned home:

(and) CIRCLE: From a 1/4 Tag or 1/4
Line formation, all but the very centers
move around the path of the outside 6
one place. If the end dancers of the center wave or line face clockwise, the outside 6 move in a CW direction; if the ends
face CCW, they all move in a CCW direction.

CONCENTRATE AND (Anything) Richard Dinkel: From any allowable formation, centers Trade + Box Circulate + Hinge as ends or outsides do the Anything call.

FEED BACK (Dan Neumann) From any allowable formation, centers Hinge and without stopping, the new very centers Trade. Simultaneously, the original ends turn back.

FLOAT TO A DIAMOND (Gene Knutson)
From facing lines of 4, ends Touch 1/4 &
Spread; then the same four do a (big) Box
Circulate around the outside. Centers do
as in Load the Boat except instead of a
Pass Thru at the end, they Pass the Ocean
instead to end the action in parallel
diamonds.

What's Happening? (continued)

HINGE BY 1, 2, 3, etc.: From a variety of possible formations, all (or designated) dancers do a Single (Partner) Hinge the number of times indicated by the first number. Then, using other hands, all who can Hinge the number of times indicated by the second number, and so on. Note that after the first Hinge, only those who have been touched by a previous Hinger can Hinge; same facing dancers start with a Partner hinge and then continue (as required) with Single Hinges.

ONE QUARTER THE DIAMOND (Wayne McDonald) From facing couples, beaus (left side dancers) Veer left to become diamond points as belles (right-side dancers) face left and Touch 1/4 turn to become diamond centers; all now do a Diamond Circulate. If the call is 3/4 the Diamond, all do a 1/4 Diamond plus 2 diamond Circulates.

RELAY THE REACTION (Fred Bliven) From parallel ocean waves, ends swing adjacent centers 1/2; new centers do a 3/4 Thru as ends Hourglass Circulate (move up). Center star now turns 1/4 as other 4 Trade. center 4 in the line of 6 Cast 3/4 as the other 4 Hourglass Circulate (move up).

RIPPLE THE BOAT (From facing lines, ends Ripple, Circulate, then Ripple In. Simultaneously, centers Ripple Out, Partner Trade and Ripple.

WITH THE FLOW (Larry Dunn) From facing couples who have been moving to the left, beaus Walk and belles Dodge. If the couple has been moving to the right, the belles Walk as the beaus Dodge. The action ends in a Box Circulate foursome.

NEW MOVEMENT (Experimental)

HARMONIZE (George Amos)

How To Do It:

From parallel 2-faced lines or ocean waves, centers Circulate 1/2 place as ends Flip (as in Flip the Diamond) and all finish like a Coordinate, i.e., the center six Trade and, without stopping, the two very centers and the two "top and bottom" lone dancers move ahead to join the remaining centers as ends of the final formation (2-faced lines produce ocean waves and vice versa).

Impressions:

The trickiest part of the teach is to keep the centers from overshooting the initial 1/2 Circulate and to keep the Flippers from passing each other. After that, it's a breeze -- providing your dancers are comfortable with Coordinate. We liked the flexibility of being able to call Harmonize from both 2-faced lines and from ocean waves. The author, incidentally, is aware that the name has been used before (see Burleson No. 2841) but he does not feel that the name is currently a part of the repertoire of most dancers and should not therefore pose any problems. He also suggests that since the dictionary offers "harmonize" as a second definition for "Coordinate", the name "Harmonize" is appropriate to describe a call with a Coordinate-like action. He also, incidentally, encourages the dancers to sing "Hmmmmm" (in harmony!) as they dance through the action of the call. Cute idea!

In our feature on left-handed columns last month, we had occasion to use a Spin the Top out of a left-hand ocean wave, It occurred to us that most MS dancers are predictably unfamiliar with that action so it would, therefore, serve as a logical feature for our Mpvin1 Down the Mainstream column this month. Unlike a Swing Thru -- which always begins with a right hand, the definition for Spin the Top requires each wave end to begin the action by turning the adjacent center 1/2; then, without stopping, the new centers turn each other 3/4 by their inside hands as the the new ends move up. Right hand waves remain righthanded and left hand waves remain lefthanded! Once again, unless your dancers are really comfortable with this kind of DBD dancing, we urge a lot of caution before springing it on your dancers.

REPORT FROM AUSTRALIA

If one may judge by the eagerness and enthusiasm of it's dancers and callers, square dancing is alive and well in Australia. Betty and I have just returned from an exciting visit that took us to both the Eastern and Western coasts of that country and we had a great time. It was out second trip down under and this time we visited Canberra, Sydney, Perth and Melbourne (in that order). I called quite a few dances and conducted several caller clinics and seminars. It was a terrific opportunity to tenew our friendship with so many of our Australian friends — as well as to make a lot of new ones—and we made the most of it. It was a fantastic experience.

While most of the dances we called were advertised at Callerlab's MS Program (no quarterlies!) we were also, on occasion scheduled to include 2 or 3 Plus tips (they call them "brackets"). And on two occasions, we were also asked to call an A1 star tip. We found the Australian dancers to be competent and capable and it was obvious that they had been well-trained. Even more impressive was the enormous enthusiasm with which they responded to our calls. And, like square dancers everywhere, friendship and sociability is stressed at all times. They form their sets, for example, by beginning each tip with a short "round-Up" -- a kind of Grand March mixer that gives everyone a chance to dance with everyone else. It accomplishes the same thing as our computer squares, but it seems to do it quicker and it also seems to be a lot more fun.

Our training sessions with the Australian callers were also very enlightening. Our presentations covered a wide range of subjects and the callers all seemed eager to learn and anxious to improve their calling skills. It was gratifying to note that while most Australian callers find it economically unfeasible to join Callerlab (the cost of attending a convention in the US is quite high for an Australian), they nevertheless have adopted the Callerlab dance programs and most of the callers we talked to support Callerlab's aims and goals. Most Australian beginner classes typically run f or the Callerlab-recommended 42 weeks and we understand that some classes last a year or longer — and that's through the MS program only — no quarterlies or Plus!

We were also asked to announce that the 27th Australian National Square Dance Convention will take place in Adelaide on April 25 thru 28, 1986. 1986 is the year when both Texas and South Australia celebrate the 150th anniversary as a state and the Australian square Dance convention will be commemorating both events. We have been given to understand that numerous square dance tours have already been formed to bring American dancers to Adelaide at that time and they are, of course anxious to encourage a lot more to do the same. (For more information contact Jeff Seidel, 20 Eyre Crescent, Valley View 5093, So., Australia. Jeff told us that they are also planning to hold a Callers Workshop (sponsored by the Australian Callers Federation in Alice Springs right after the convention.)

In the past few years, Betty and I have been fortunate enough to travel to many parts of the square dance world (we typically go by ourselves and we do not, as a rule, lead a tour). We have always found square dancers to be great people — in the U.S. and Canada — in England, Germany, Holland, Belgium and Sweden — in Japan and in New Zealand — and new again throughout the length and breadth of Australia. And while this no longer surprises us, it is always impressive, and we are thankful to be a part of the activity.

Steve Minkin picked up on our recent themed singing call features and sent in a set of his own which uses the familiar:

And, from there:

- 2) Pass Thru, Bend the Line, go up & back & Slide Thru Swing the corner, Promenade (Tag)
- Rollaway 1/2 Sashay, Curlique & then
 Boys Run, Corner Swing, Promenade my friend (Tag)
- 4) Flutterwheel go cross the floor & Sweep 1/4 more Swing that Corner lady boys & Promenade the floor (Tag)
- 5) Slide Thru...Slide Thru/....Slide Thru Corner Swing, Promenade (Tag!)

We picked up a number of ideas for our Share the Wealth feature in Australia. Here's a cute "Opening Biggie" we got from Brian Hotchkies:

Head men take both girls to the middle and back Same 6 Pass Thru and do a U-Turn Back Side men take two girls to the middle and back Same 6 Slide Thru (AL!)

Barry Wonson came up with this routine using a "Funny" Diamond:

SIGHT CALLER'S NOTEBOOK (FORMATION MANAGEMENT SERIES)

Part 5. PARALLEL 2-FACED LINES

Right-facing parallel 2-faced lines is one of square dancing's most frequently-encountered formations and the current emphasis that the activity seems to be placing on DBD/APD choreography serves to underscore the importance of a sight caller's ability to establish all of the six possible 2-faced line arrangements that can occur with symmetric choreography. We'll begin our examination of this very popular formation by describing some easy -- and fairly obvious -- ways to set up both it's normal and it's half-sashayed arrangements:

To Establish a Zero (normal) 2-Faced Line Arrangement - ØF (right-facing)

From Home (or from	a) 1-3 lead right, Veer Left
any static square set—up)	b) 1–3 Square Thru, Swing Thru, boys Run
	c) 1–3 Square Thru, Single Circle to a Wave Boys Trade, boys Run
From a Zero/Normal 8–Chain Thru Arrangement (ØB)	 a) Swing Thru, boys Run b) Single Circle to a Wave Boys Trade, boys Run c) Veer Left (but only if one may (assume acceptable body flow).
From Zero/Normal Facing Lines (ØL)	 a) Pass the Ocean, Swing Thru, boys Run b) Star Thru, Right & Left Thru, Veer Left c) Touch 1/4, Coordinate
From Zero/Normal Columns (ØC)	a) Girls Turn Back Swing Thru, boys Run b) Triple Scoot, boys Run, Veer Left c) Coordinate

To establish a ØF arrangement from a zero/normal Double Pass Thru, simply call centers Pass Thru (to establish a zero/normal 8-Chain Thru) and then proceed as shown above. From a Trade By that is zero/normal, call Trade By to get an zero 8-Chain Thru and proceed as above. From a zero/normal right-facing diamonds arrangement, call Diamond Circulate, Flip the Diamond, girls Trade, Swing Thru and the boys Run.

WHAT'S HAPPENING?

Just about everyone, it seems, has been working with the new Plus QS Selection Load the Top. We have a hunch that this one may be around for some time. We've provided some additional material in this month's issue and if you haven't used it before, you might want to give it a try.

It also seems that when it comes to considering good new experimentals, it's either feast or famine. After several months of relative "famine", this month would definitely fall into the "feast" category. Quite a few new and interesting ideas crossed our desk this month and, for a change, we had a tough time deciding which of them to feature. We finally decided on Peel to a Wave and Coordinate the Gears -- but many of the ones listed below were strong contenders.

CHASE THE WAVE (Johnny Hayes) From lines of 4 facing out, all start a Chase the Tag but when trailers meet (as in a 3/4 Tag) they Swing Thru and without stopping, Extend. Leaders meanwhile 1/4 Right, Circulate one place and 1/4 Right again to end the action in parallel OWs.

CIRCLE TO A DIAMOND: Facing couples Circle Left 1/4 and, without stopping, beaus Box Circulate 1-1/2 as belles Dodge + Extend to end in right-hand diamonds. If the call is Circle 1/2 or 3/4, all Circle left the indicated amount then finish as in Circle to a Diamond.

EXPLODE IT: From a 1/4 Tag formation, those in the wave Explode the Wave as the other four face each other and with right hands, pull by + Fold to face those who Exploded. Ends in an 8-Chain Thru formation.

What's Happening? (continued)

LEVITATE: From columns, centers Trade and Spread and, without stopping, do a Zing. Simultaneously, the other 4 do a Vertical 1/2 Tag and then Quarter Thru to end in a 1/4 Tag formation.

SURF'S UP (Bill Davis): From parallel lines of waves, all 1/2 Circulate. Without stopping, centers Fan the Top as the others Trade and then all do a Fan the Top.

SWAT (Mort Simpson): From a completed Double Pass Thru formation, the lead pair does a Single Wheel as the trailers do a Partner Tag. This results in a formation that the author has dubbed the "Rolling Pin" (i.e., a Single Double Pass Thru fourflanked by back-to-back pairs. The name of the call SWAT refers to the initials for Single Wheel and (partner) Tag.

CHOREO SYMBOLS

Here's the final installment in our current re-cap of the symbols we use in these notes. Prior issues have described the symbols used to define particular dancer set-ups (we indicate only lines and boxes). We also, whenever we feel it would be useful, define significant formations and arrangements and, in such cases, we use the symbols that have been approved by Callerlab. In the Callerlab system, each formation is assigned a letter (usually the initial of the formation's name) as shown

Each letter is preceded by one of six numbers (0, 1/2, 1-2-3-4) and this indicates the specific arrangement or boy-girl placement of the indicated formation:

0 = Zero/normal arrangement

1/2 = 1/2 Sashayed arrangement

- I = Same Sex pairs (boy pairs in Reference Spot)
- 2 = Same Sex pairs (girl pairs in Reference spot)
- 3 = Mixes Sex pairs (normal pair in Reference Spot)
- 4 = Mixed Sex pairs (1/2 Sashayed pairs in Reference Spot).

NEW MOVEMENT (Experimental)

PEEL TO A WAVE (Dick Bayer)

How To Do It:

From columns, the first and third dancers in each column Peel Off and, without stopping, do a Crossover Circulate, i.e., outfacers Cross Run into the nearest infacing center spot as the infacers Circulate forward but cross into the outfacing center spot of the final ocean wave formation. Simultaneously, the second and fourth column dancers Extend, Trade and Spread apart to become ends of the final famation. Zero right-hand columns produce zero right-hand parallel ocean waves.

Impressions:

Dick has come up with a smooth and clever traffic pattern. It could no doubt be easily taught to either Plus or Mainstream dancers although we suspect it will have it's greatest appeal with Advanced dancers who are already familiar with the Crossover Circulate concept. The name has been used before (Burleson 3946) for an action that is identical to a Peel and Trail.

The command "Trade" is one of the most frequently called commands on the Mainstream list. It is also one of the most useful. Sight callers often use Trades to change existing partner pairings and while, in some situations they do not alter the dancers' formation, there are other choreographic environments in which a formation change is affected by a Trade -- usually with a certain amount of surprise on the part of the dancers. Note the following Trade drills:

How To Do It:

From single file right-hand columns, all Circulate 1-1/2 places to form 3 pairs (column of 6) with a lonesome dancer at either end as in the first pat of Coordinate. From here, without stopping, each lonesome dancer and the adjacent pair extend right hands to form two 3-hand stars and, as each star starts to turn, each of the 2 very center dancers also extends a right hand to join the star they face, thus blending into 2 4-hand right hand stars. Each star now turns 3/4 and the new adjacent (very center) dancers in each star now Trades with a left hand and then turns the one they meet 3/4 by the right as the other four slide slightly apart to become the ends of the final parallel 2-faced lines firmation. From left-hand columns, the action is the same except that the stars are left-hand stars and the above-described hand contacts are reversed (right becomes left and vice versa!).

Impressions:

The action for this movement starts like a Coordinate but quickly converts to a double-star "gears"-type pattern. We confess a strong bias for star type movements and we especially liked the flow when the centers join the 2 3-hand stars to make 'em 4-hand stars (shades of Venus and Mars!). We don't know what the future holds in store for this call but for now, it does make a dandy workshop experimental (if you happen to be in the market for one).

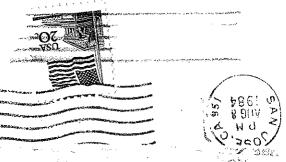

Part 5. PARALLEL TWO-FACED LINES (Same Sex & Mixed Sex Versions)

Last month's two-faced lines feature was exclusively concerned with how a caller may establish the normal (zero) and 1/2 Sashayed arrangements when working with parallel right-facing 2-faced lines. We continue our examination of 2-faced lines arrangements this month with an examination of how a caller may establish the same sex (boy pairs/girl pairs) and mixed sex (one pair normal and one pair 1/2 Sashayed) arrangements of this very popular formation.

WHAT'S HAPPENING?

As one might expect, the new Plus Program Quarterly, Load the Top, has been seeing a lot of action this past summer. In spite of this, however, you still won't find many places where you can call it cold, i.e., without a walkthru first. Calling it from arrangements other than a zero line (normal lines) is also ill-advised without first exposing the dancers to an in-depth DBD workshop.

It also sometimes happens that the

effect of a popular new QS move is that it takes the place of a previous QS move. This doesn't seem to be the case with Load the Top. Which is to say that the Plus dancers we've called for recently are still able to zip through a call to Spin Chain the Gears! Interesting!

Here are the new calls we looked at this past month:

ADVANCE (Jack Berg): From parallel ocean waves, all Extend and, without stopping, the those facing out turn back to end in a 1/4 Tag formation. If the call is to ADVANCE BY, all do an Advance but centers Pass Thru to end in an 8-Chain Thru formation.

CHASE ROTATE TO A COLUMN/WAVE (Joe Lucas) From facing out lines of four, all 1/2 Chase the Tag to form a momentary parallel OW formation and then, without stopping, all Split Counter Rotate to end the action in side-by-side columns.

CUP CAKE: From a 1/4 Tag formation, wave dancers Hinge + Walk and Dodge + Cloverleaf as, simultaneously, the outsides Extend to form a new wave in the center. The action ends in another 1/4 Tag formation.

What's Happening? (continued)

DIAGONAL TRANSFER & ROLL:

From right-hand columns, No. 1 & 2 dancers walk single file around the adjacent column to the mid-point where, without stopping the 1/4 in + Roll. Simultaneously, the No. 3 & 4 dancers move forward on a slight diagonal to join left hands (leader meets trailer) in a momentary left-hand Box Circulate foursome in the center. These 4 now Trade to end the action in parallel left-hand 2-faced lines.

GRANNY'S KNOT (Jack Berg) From parallel OWs, all Extend the Tag. Centers then Linear Cycle as outsides Partner Tag and, without stopping, Circulate to the other end. Ends in facing lines of 4.

HUBS/RIMS ANYTHING (Nate Bliss): From parallel lines with centers facing in: Hubs 1/4 Thru: All Cast Off 1/4, new centers Trade; Hubs 3/4 Thru, All Cast Off 3/4 new centers Trade; Rims 1/4 Thru: Ends & adjacent centers Cast in 1/4 (Bend the Line) and new centers Trade; Rims 3/4 Thru: Ends & adjacent centers Cast in 3/4, new centers Trade. Other possibilities are noted.

KEY LINE CHAIN (Jack Berg) From parallel lines or waves, all Hinge, new centers Hinge and very centers Trade as ends Circulate. Without stopping new centers Hinge + all Hinge.

TEN PINS (Nate Bliss) A memory exercise requiring the dancers to memorize the 10 calls below in the exact sequence listed:

1. Slip

6. Zig

2. Slide

7. Zaa

3. Swing

8. Zoom

4. Slither

9. Zing

5. Mix

10. Roll

Any number may be directed (5 Pins, 8 pins, etc.. If, after a call to do an indi-

cated number of pins, another call or calls is used, it is then possible to call "Complete Your Spare" -- which means to do the remaining 3 calls, It is also possible to call "Strike" -- which means to do all ten.

SHARE THE WEALTH

Brian Hotchkies wrote to tell us that the Opening "Biggie" we printed in this column in our July 1984 issue (page 1587) will also work if you have the Head girls take two boys forward & back, etc. Thanks for the tip!

Speaking of Opening "Biggies", here's one for Advanced dancers that was submitted by Neil Grossman:

NEW MOVEMENT (Experimental)

CIRCULATE THE TOP (Jerry Biggerstaff)

How To Do It:

From parallel ocean waves, all Circulate once and one-half to form a momentary 4-dancer wave flanked by two mini-waves on either side. Those in the 4-dancer wave now Spin the Top as the mini-waves each turn by inside hands one full turn (360°) Then, without stopping, each wave does a Fan the Top to end the action in parallel ocean waves.

Impressions:

Now that Peel the Top has been selected as a Plus Program Quarterly, we can expect to see a rash of similar action movements. Circulate the Top was no doubt inspired by the traffic pattern of Peel the Top and it is the first such spin-off to cross our desk. The action flows nicely — but you might want to ask yourself whether your dancers will really enjoy another move with a similar "feel" to it. The action could be used as a neat way to drill your dancers in the precise positioning of a 1-1/2 Circulate and, since most dancers are able to Circulate in all wave arrangements, Circulate the Top would seem to have no built—in DBD restrictions.

THREE AND ONE LINES

The recent addition of Cycle & Wheel to the Advanced Lists brings with it a danger that some Advanced dancers might expect—or be conditioned to expect—that their caller will call a Cycle and Wheel everytime he sets 'em up in a 3x1 line formation. The truth, of course, is that many Advanced calls can be correctly done from 3x1 lines and it is therefore a good idea far Advanced callers to regularly drill their dancers in as many 3x1 applications as possible.

We'll spread our examples over two issues: this month we'll feature A1 calls from 3x1 lines and next month we'll do the same for the A2 calls.

SOME HEXAGON ROUTINES_

We recently received some hifty Hexagon Squares material from Brian Hotchkies in New South Wales, Australia. We've done several features on Hexagons in the past, but that was quite some time ago and, since we liked Brian's material so much, we thought it would be a good idea to pass it along. Remember that Hexagons are set up as 6-couple squares (rectangles, really) with 2 couples (lines of four) in each of the Head positions and one couple each at the Sides. Remember too, that like most gimmick choreography, Hexagons are easy to overdo. Give your dancers a brief taste -- and then move on to something else. Here are some of Brian's routines:

SIGHT CALLER'S NOTEBOOK

ACHIEVING PARTNER PAIRINGS IN 2-FACED LINES

As every experienced sight caller knows, the sight resolution process will, in almost every case, make it necessary for a caller to somehow pair up at least one of his or her key couples. No matter what kind of resolution formula a sight caller uses, he must, at some point in the process, pair up at least one of his key couples. A student sight caller is generally told that the easiest way to accomplish such a partner pairing is to establish either parallel ocean waves or parallel 2-faced lines and, from there, no dancer is ever more than two Circulates (by either the ends or the centers) away from his or her original partner. And while such information is unquestionably accurate, it can sometimes also tempt a trainee sight caller to generate choreography that is not as smooth as it might be.

Experienced caller coaches all agree that there is a very common and oft-noted tendency for new sight callers, when they first attempt the resolution process, to focus their attention on the couple they have identified as their "Primary" couple. Such students will typically establish parallel right-facing 2-faced lines and then Circulate that Primary man to his original partner -- even if, as it often happens, it might be easier and smoother to pair up their "secondary" couple. In such cases, there is no really serious problem if the pairing is successfully accomplished with only a one-place Circulate. But if, on the other hand, the pairing requires a two-place Circulate, the centers must stand inactive (interrupt their flow) for at least four beats while the ends are moving up around the outside. And while this is patently undesirable, it can still be considered to be acceptable if it doesn't occur too often. A three-place Circulate, however, is never acceptable and this means that a student Sight Caller needs to find a better way to affect partner pairings. He needs, in other words, to be able to pair up his key dancers without relying solely and exclusively on having the ends Circulate the required number of places.

With symmetric choreography, 16 different dancer set-ups are possible when a caller establishes parallel right-facing zero 2-faced lines:

- 1. All couples pairs (boys in sequence CCW)
- 2. All couples paired (boys out of sequence CW)
- 3. Only outfacting couples pairs (boys CCW)
- 4. Only outfacing couples paired (boys CW)
- 5. Only infacing couples paired (boys CCW)
- 6. Only infacing couples paired (boys CW)
- 7. All couples paired with opposites (boys CCW)
- 8. All couples paired with opposites (boys CW)
- 9. All couples paired with corners (boys CCW)
- 10. All couples paired with corners (boys CW)
- 11. All couples paired with right-hand dancer (boys CCW)
- 12. All couples paired with right-hand dancer (boys CW)
- 13. Outfacer paired with corner; infacer paired with right hand dancer (boys CCW)

 14. Outfacer paired with corner; infacer paired with right-hand dancer (boys CW)
- 15.. Outfacer paired with right-hand dancer; infacer paired with corner (boys CCW)
- 16. Outfacer paired with right-hand dancer; infacer paired with corner (boys CW)

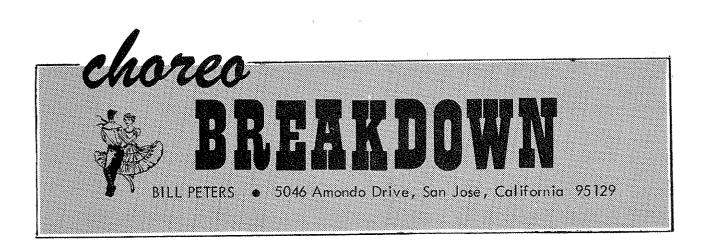

Notice that in the first 6 set-ups one or more couples are already paired and a caller can then proceed to the next step of the resolution process. It is when a caller does not find a pairing that he may tend to sacrifice smoothness for the sake of a successful pairing (as in a 3-place Circulate!). It turns out that in the ten 2-faced line set-ups that do not already contain a paired couple, a successful pairing can always be achieved in one of three ways:

- a) Call Ends Circulate
- b) Call Centers Trade
- c) Call Ends Circulate, centers Trade (Acey Deucey)

It is also a fact that in the 2-faced lines where pairings do not already exist, the only times when a pairing is not quickly achievable with either (a) an Ends Circulate or (b) a centers Trade is in the two set-ups in which all dancers are paired with their original opposites and, in that event, Acey Deucey will achieve a pairing.

This means that it is never necessary for a caller to Circulate the ends more than one place in order to achieve a pairing and this means that it is therefore also unnecessary for a sight caller to sacrifice smooth choreography in order to implement a successful resolution. New or student sight callers are therefore urged to learn not only how to quickly spot pairings when they exist, but to also learn how to recognize when pairings may be accomplished with either an Ends Circulate or a Centers Trade....and to realize that if neither call produces a pairing, an Acey Deuces (Ends Circulate while centers Trade) will!

WHAT'S HAPPENING?

It doesn't happen very often, but it does happen every now and then -- and this is one of those times. Only a couple of fairly insignificant moves crossed our desk this months we are unable to provide our usual list of new calls

nor are we able to feature a new experimental for your consideration. We've decided, instead, to share some Magic Column material with you and to report an interesting chareographic experiment we recently heard about.

It seems that a couple of well-known callers focused a video camera on a square of very competent Challenge dancers and filmed them as they called a variety of sequences. Here's the gimmick: Some complete sequences contained nothing but Plus calls, some nothing but Advanced, some were exclusively MS and others were Challenge. Each routine had been carefully planned ahead of time and both callers and dancers were asked to strive for the maximum amount of smoothness and flow. We understand that all succeeded admirably and that when the tape was shown to several other callers (picture only - no sound) those callers were unable to accurately distinguish between the various levels and everything seemed to flow smoothly and easily. There was no discernable stop-and-go or pull-andjerk type dancing.

The acknowledged purpose of the experiment was to prove that Challenge dancing could be smooth and dance-like and that when it isn't, the fault lies with the caller -- and possibly the dancers -- and not with the material.

Any of our readers hear of any similar experiments? We'd like tohear about them.

SHARE THE WEALTH

We drew a number of responses to our choreo puzzle last month. The puzzle, you will recall, was sent in by Laurie Abrams and asked you to identify a formation from which it is possible to call two Trade-Bys in succession. Most of those who answered came up with the obvious solution, i,e., to set up a square formation in which either Heads or Sides are facing out. We did, however, get some other ideas which are very interesting.

Don Beck suggested that 2 Trade-Bys could be done from unsymmetric 2-faced lines (one right-facing, the other left-facing) as in a Zero Line plus couples 1 and 4 California Twirl (or 2 and 3). Brian Hotchkies from Australia also sent us that possibility and wonders if a Trade By can be done from inverted lines (ends facing in, centers facing out, or vice versa). Brian also suggests that it might even be possible to call 2 or more Trade Bys from symmetric parallel 2-faced lines if we require the infacing couple to Pass Thru diagonally. That call has, of course already been invented (It's called Trade Circulate and it appears regularly in the A2 program).

It is also interesting to observe that both Don and Brian suggested a similar puzzle:

From what formation is it possible to call two Flip the Diamonds in succession.

The answer to that one is fairly obvious, but in the interest of keeping the puzzle thing alive we'll ask you to think on it and let us know.

Here are a couple of get-outs by Jim Davis:

USING MAGIC COLUMNS IN THE MAINSTREAM PROGRAM

We have, on a number of occasions, observed that even though a particular formation is typically regarded as a so-called "Advanced" or Challenge" formation, it is generally always possible to both get into and out of such formations using only Mainstream calls. This means that it is therefore also possible for a Mainstream caller to use such formations in his regular Mainstream programs. Some interesting Mainstream choreography could, for example, be built around such supposedly Advanced and Challenge formations as Hourglasses, Offset Blocks, T-Bones, etc. -- and it is also possible to do the same thing with a fairly recently identified formation that is usually relegated to the Challenge program: the so-called "Magic Columns".

It is possible to establish both right-hand and left-hand Magic Columns. If, from facing lines of four, the ends Touch 1/4 and the centers Left Touch 1/4, we get right-hand Magic Columns (RMC), and if the ends Left Touch 1/4 and the centers Touch 1/4, we get left-hand Magic Columns (LMC). The routines below develop a Magic Column theme using only Mainstream calls.

Head 2 Promenade, 1/2 way round you go Lead to the right & Circle 4, make a little line you know Go up and back, then Slide Thru now you Dosado Make that wave, Spin Chain Thru 2 by 2 you know Girls Circulate 2 spots and everybody Swing Swing that lady round and round the Promenade that ring ...add 16-beat tag.

And finally, here's a break routine that's been around for awhile that features an unusual 4-couple Dixie Style: (Thanks to Jim Diffey!)

4 ladies Chain, turn 'em for me
Turn that gal & send her back
4 couples Dixie Style
Hang right on, the boys swing in
Back up in that Thar
(adjust timing to suit)
Slip the Clutch, Left Allemande
Get on back & Swing
...add 16-beat tag

QUARTERLY SELECTIONS

PLUS PROGRAM

Callerlab has announced that there will be no Plus Quarterly Selection for the three-month period beginning November 1st, 1984.

MAINSTREAM PROGRAM

Callerlab has also announced that "Grand Parade" has been chosen as the Quarterly Selection for the Mainstream Program for the three-month period beginning October 1st, 1984. This move has been around for at least ten years now (we introduced way back in May of 1974 -- see page 365) and has always been on the fringe of the MS and Plus programs ever since. The action is one of these 64 beat - everybody working - begin at home/end at home actions that many callers like because it allows them to sing the original lyrics of a singing call.

Here is the definition as published by Callerlab:

GRAND PARADE (Mort Simpson)

Heads step forward to a momentary wave; ends and the adjacent centers turn 1/2 and the new centers now turn 3/4; each Side lady now steps forward to her right (to Head position) to become the partner of the Head man now in that position, while the Side men take Head ladies out of the center with a Courtesy Turn. All now Promenade 1/w way around the set and face in. Repeat all of this action again starting with the heads. The sides will then repeat the action of the heads, while the heads do the action of the sides and repeat all of those actions again. The total action is a four times through routine.

Callerlab has also provided the following teaching hints:

The dancers should be advaised, during the teach, that after doing the first part of the four times through action, the head gents will be in their home positions but the side gents will be in their opposite place. Similarly, the first time the Sides do the action (the third part of the four times through action), they will end up with the side men at home and the head men in their opposite places. After completing the entire action (i.e., four times through) all will be back at home and all will be with their original partners.

Callerlab further notes that this is a workshop figure and therefore, not necessarily one which the dancers must commit to memory. Note too that each man dances with one lady twice — and not with one lady at all — during the entire sequence. Also, since the routine requires a Courtesy Turn, please note that the call is thus restricted (in the Plus and Mainstream programs) to normal squares, i.e., to squares in which each boy has a girl on his right side.

Since this is a start at home/end at home routine, no dancing examples are required.

MOVIN' DOWN THE MAINSTREAM

CENTERS IN/CAST OFF VARIATIONS

The standard and traditional way to call the combination "Centers In and Cast Off 3/4" is from a Completed Double Pass Thru formation. Note that from that formation, both the outside dancers and those who are required to do the Centers In action are all facing in the same direction. This means that a good way for a caller to generate choreographic interest and variety with the Centers In/Cast Off combination would be to call the series from formations in which the outsides and those who do the Centers In are not facing in the same direction—as for example:

THE PLUS PROGRAM

WORKING WITH LEFTY DIAMONDS

Plus Program callers seem to be always searching for new and different ways to exploit diamond choreography. One very obvious — but seldom used — way to do this is to have the dancers work with left-handed (rather than the more common right-handed) diamonds. Lefty diamonds can be fun, although a caller must always remember that in order to do this effectively, he himself (or she, herself) must be completely comfortable with the ins and outs of left-hand choreography in general — and so, of course, must the dancers.

Here are some ideas for you to consider:

• SIGHT CALLER'S NOTEBOOK

A COMPARISON OF CALLING METHODS (by Don Beck)

Ask any of the more successful callers whether they recommend sight calling, mental image calling, or zeros and equivalents, and they will probably tell you that they use a little of each! Although probably true, this answer is not much help to the caller looking for a little guidance. Let's look at some of the advantages and disadvantages of each system.

There seems to be pressure on callers these days to become sight callers. If a caller is not already one, he is likely to apologize for that fact! Why does sight calling have this stature? Well, there are definite advantages to sight calling. No other system allows you, the caller, as complete a freedom to totally allow your spur of the moment creativity to come out. No other system allows you to add new calls to your repertoire with so little additional effort. No other system allows such complete variety with so little memorizing.

There are, however, some definite disadvantages. You must be able to accurately memorize who started with whom in your key square(s), each tip. You must be able to execute your resolve techniques on the fly, without disrupting the flow or timing of your dance. You are at the mercy of the dancers in your key square. If they make a mistake, you may not be able to resolve their square, or the rest of the floor, successfully.

Mental image choreography relieves you of the dependence on your dancers. It allows you to resolve more quickly and easily. It allows you to ad lib singing call figures without having to memorize a new corner each sequence. It allows practice without dancers.

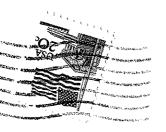
There are of course disadvantages to mental image calling also. Your ability to free wheel is not nearly as great as it is with sight calling. There are more rules to learn when learning the system. (Fortunately, however, a few of the rules will get you started and, as you learn more, you just add to your versatility. Some calls don't lend themselves to being followed. Although resolving takes less mental effort than when sight calling, you are required to keep track of more in your mind, before you get to the resolve phase of each sequence.

Memorizing zeros and equivalents is a good way to get started. It is a system that is easy to understand, and your effort in memorizing will not have gone to waste if you eventually graduate to sight or mental image. There always seem to be appropriate times to insert memorized modules. The greatest disadvantage, however, is that you are very limited. To stay fresh and ahead of your dancers, you must constantly memorize new material. There are other disadvantages too. Once you have started calling a memorized module, you are committed to it, and if the majority of your floor breaks down at the beginning of it, you can't escape quickly. If a call that you were not intending to use accidentally slips out, you do not have the ability to continue on from where you are.

My advise is to work towards sight, but if you are willing to work, mental image is the best route to follow on your way there. The versatility of sight calling cannot be matched. The basic knowledge of the workings of choreography that mental image choreography gives you is an invaluable tool. The caller who can do both can use mental image to assist himself in his sight resolutions

and free himself from memorized get-outs. It also gives him something to fall back on when everyone in a strange group is wearing green! Any one system will work, but a combination will make you feel that much more able to handle all situations as well.

Publisher's Postscript: (by Bill Peters)

The above material marks the first time that Choreo Breakdown has published an article that was written by someone other than myself. I did it for two reasons:

- 1. I consider the subject (the comparison of calling methods) to be both interesting and important and it is one that, for some reason, is seldom discussed in print although it is often a primary topic of conversation whenever callers get together; and
- 2. I consider Don to be singularly qualified to write such an article and I value his opinions and his insight. Don is an accomplished sight caller and regularly uses both sight calling and mental image calling in his own patter presentations. As many of you no doubt know, Don is also the author of "Out of Sight" -- a book that I regard as the best how-to-do-it book in the field of mentalimage calling that is currently available.

WHAT'S HAPPENING?

Sorry to be a bit late this month. We've just returned from a ten-day East Coast calling tour that took us from Maine to South Carolina and while we had a great experience, we also got a bit behind in our work. We'll be back on schedule next month.

- More than Resolution .. Page 1628

Things are starting to gear up for the upcoming Callerlab convention in Phoenix next year and one of the hot-potato issues that will (hopefully) be decided at that meeting is the thorny question of partners in an ocean wave. There is a very loud and vocal group who insists that partners in an ocean wave should be identified as the dancers who are facing the same way. Another group —

equally loud and equally vocal -- is just as insistent that wave partners be identified as each end and the adjacent center. And unless you've been away at the South Pole for the past six months you've undoubtedly heard all the arguments from both sides.We personally favor some form of compromise solution. We see nothing wrong, for example, in considering that ocean wave partners are the same facing dancer in all cases -- except where the requirements of a particular call or choreographic situation might dictate differently. That would, to be sure, establish an inconsistent definition, but that would be preferable to a prolonged controversy. The vast majority of exceptions would occur in the Advanced and Challenge programs and it seems to us that those dancers (and their callers) have already learned how to cope with this kind of inconsistency (2 definitions for Recycle depending on the starting formation -- and the same with Trade Circulate, etc.) In any event, the issue will soon be debated and decided and we're prepared to go along with whatever the outcome is. We hope that you are too!

Here's this month crop of new calls:

BREAKAWAY From any wave or line between outside pairs (as in 1/4 Tag), the very centers Trade as the ends of the center four Flip Out (leaving a "double hole"). Simultaneously, the outside pairs Divide and, moving into the "double hole", they Touch. Left Breakaway is the same except Dividers Left Touch.

What's Happening? (continued)

CIRCULATE THE TOP (Jerry Biggerstaff)
From parallel waves or lines, all Circulate
1-1/2 + centers Spin the Top as outsides
Trade twice and without stopping, all now
Fan the Top (name used before).

CROSS & SLITHER (Paul McNutt) From parallel ocean waves, ends Cross Fold as centers slide nose-to-nose (Slither) and Extend forward. RH waves produce RH columns; LH waves produce LHcolumns.

CROSS SHADOW THE DIAMOND (Wayne McDonald) From center-to-center diamonds, points do the ends part of a Cast the Shadow as the centers Hinge. Outfacing center now does a Cross Cloverleaf to become a center of the final 2-faced lines formation as the infacing center Extends to do a Left Touch 1/4 and Extends again to occupy the remaining center position of the final 2-faced lines.

DISPERSE (The Anything) Lee Kopman
An expansion of the original call which began
from columns only, this call may begin from
parallel lines, waves or columns. Centers do a
Box Counter Rotate + Trade & Spread, as the
others 1/2 Zoom, Hinge and (phantom) column
Circulate 2 places. (name used before)

FLIP THE DIXIE (Phil Handel) From a LH OW centers Hinge 1/4 as the ends turn back to form a momentary diamond. All then Flip the Diamond.

GRAND SQUARE CHAIN THRU (Richard Dinkel) From an 8-Chain Thru formation all give a right and pull by, then 1/4 in & Left Touch (LH Tidal Wave). Without stopping, all now do a Grand Left Swing Thru plus Left Turn Thru to end the action in backto=back lines of four.

HIT & RUN (Bill P endlebury & Barry Wonson) Facing dancers Touch 1/4 and, without stopping, outfacers Run. If the call is Hit & Miss, the action is the same except that the infacers Run.

INDIAN STYLE TO AN OCEAN WAVE (Burl Lally). From a Double Pass Thru formation, all Extend the Tag twice (momentary parallel ocean waves) then Hinge. From a line or wave, all 1/2 Tag + Hinge.

POP THE CYCLE (Bob McGowan) From a 1/4 or 3/4 Tag or DPT formation, centers Spin the Top as the outsides do a (partner) Hinge. Without stopping the inside Hinger now Folds behind the other Hinger and, in single file, these dancers now Promenade 1/4 around the outside and face in. The Spin the Top dancers then Extend to end the action in parallel ocean waves.

POWERHOUSE RELAY From parallel ocean waves, ends Circulate 1-1/2 as centers Trade 1-1/2. Now the very centers Trade as the lonesome dancers 1/2 Circulate. The wave of 6 does a 2/3 Tag the Line Zig-Zag; the outside 4 1/2 Circulate; the very centers Cast Off 3/4 as the mini-wave dancers Trade and Ionesome dancers 1/2 Circulate. Outside 4 now 1/2 Circulate as center 4 Cast Off 3/4 to end in parallel waves (equal to a Split Circulate Double).

SWING & STROLL (Nonie Moglia) From a Double Pass Thru or 1/4 Tag formation, centers Swing Thru as the outside LH dancer (beau) to pair up (on the outside) with the new center wave end and, without stopping, these pairs Promenade forward (Extend) and Wheel In as in Wheel & Deal. The other outside dancers (belle) step forward to stand shoulder to shoulder and the dancer coming from the center Runs around the original outsider. Ends in a DPT formation.

NEW MOVEMENT (Experimental)

PADDLE THRU (Bob Elling)

How To Do It:

From facing lines of four, the center four Pass the Ocean as the ends Slide Thru. The action may end in a variety of formations and arrangements depending upon the starting arrangement of the initial lines. When called from a normal/zero lines arrangement, Paddle Thru produces a No. 3 1/4 Tag arrangement, i.e., outsides are normal while the wave dancers are 1/2 Sashayed.

Impressions:

This is another one of those interesting calls that features a simple and easy-to-learn definition but which the caller can also make as easy -- or as difficult -- as his program requirements may dictate, simply by altering the arrangement of the starting lines. We found that it teaches easiest out of No. 1 lines (BBGG) since, from there, the actions of both ends (Slide Thru) and the centers (Pass the Ocean) are "normal". We also urge every caller to exercise a bit of judgment before calling this move from some of it's more difficult arrangements.

MOVIN' DOWN THE MAINSTREAM

While we have heard some grumbling this past month about the fact that both Grand Spin and Grand Parade are now on the Callerlab QS lists, most callers have nevertheless made it a point to workshop the more recent Grand Parade and most dancers have by this time had a reasonable opportunity to learn the action. We have also heard some comments to the effect that Grand Parade has very little use in a patter presentation and that it's primary application is that it allows a caller to sing a full chorus of original lyrics in a singing call. That, of course, is not totally true since it is possible to add some patter call interest by simply fractionalizing the 4-part Grand Parade action as shown below:

EXPLODE THE WAVE

Explode the Wave has been, for some time now, a staple of the Plus List. We nevertheless sometimes get the feeling that some Plus Program callers tend to shy away from using Explode the Wave because it leaves the dancers in outfacing lines and they (the callers) seem -- for some reason -- to be a bit uncomfortable in that formation. This need not, of course, be the case since many eminently usable follow-up calls exist that will quickly -- and smoothly -- convert outfacing lines into something a bit more manageable.

A NEW ADVANCED QUARTERLY SELECTION: HARMONIZE

Callerlab's Advanced Quarterly Selection Committee has published the results of it's recent Keep/Drop ballot. All of the current moves on the Advanced QS list will remain on the list for the next six months,

The committee also announced a new selection for the quarter beginning December 1st -- "Harmonize" by George Amos -- a move we featured last July (see page 1582). The Advanced QS List now consists of the following calls:

Change Lanes Mini Busy

Linear Action Zing

Harmonize

The Callerlab release also contained a definition for Harmonize which is worded a bit differently than the one we used in July. It describes an identical dance action but while we related the move to the action of a Coordinate, the Callerlab release compares a part of the action to an Hourglass Circulate. Here's the Callerlab definition plus some new routines (the first two routines are from the Callerlab release, as is the singing call figure):

HARMONIZE: From parallel lines or waves with centers in a mini wave - centers 1/2 Circulate as the ends Flip to the nearest center, Triple Trade, very centers and lonesome ends move up as in an Hourglass Circulate. Timing ten beats.

• SIGHT CALLER'S NOTEBOOK

THERE'S MORE TO SIGHT CALLING THAN SIGHT RESOLUTION

In recent months we've conducted caller clinics and seminars in both East Coast and West Coast locations and we have, as a result, become aware of what can only be described as a rather curious phenomenon, to wit: that while more and more callers are now able to accurately resolve the set -- which is to say that they have studied and practiced the skills necessary to allow them to visually bring the dancers back to their original home positions from just about any normal or standard dancer set-up -- they are, neverthless, in many cases strangely reluctant to do so on any kind of regular basis. We have lately observed that a good many callers who know how to resolve still seem to prefer using zeros, equivalents and other modular constructions as their primary calling method, and that they use sight calling techniques only when they are more or less forced into it such as when they suffer a memory lapse or when engaged in a student calling exercise -- and always providing, of course, that they have remembered to check out the requisite key dancers in a pilot square!

In some ways this is understandable. Many callers, we suspect, are a bit uncomfortable when "free-wheeling" and they simply do not trust themselves to be able to improvise or extemporize square dance choreography that is interesting and fun to dance and that the dancers will not find repetitive and eventually predictable. The truth, however, is that the dancers will be even more bored if their caller requires them to dance the same old zeros over and over again., and that while learning how to improvise effectively is oftentimes a lot easier said than done, there is simply no substitute for it and the caller who continues to avoid it is simply defeating his own purposes.

The fact is that extemporaneous choreography does not have to be tough to do -- once a caller has mastered the techniques of smoothly manipulating the dancers from one formation/arrangement to another. This is the skill we now identify as Formation Management and it has become increasingly important to the modern square dance caller. Once a caller has learned how to resolve the set, his next goal is to study formations and dancer arrangements so that he will always know -- beforehand -- the precise formation and arrangement that a given call will produce in a given situation, as well as a reasonable number of command options when the dancers are in that particular set-up. And while this is often a lot harder to learn than set resolution, it is really not all that difficult.

We usually suggest that callers learn the techniques of Formation Management by learning how to establish (and then "normalize") the six different facing lines arrangements that it is possible to achieve with symmetric choreography. This may take a bit of work with the dolly-board or by pushing checkers around on the kitchen table, but once this is learned the rest is easy. Once a caller "owns" the 6 facing lines arrangements, he is then only a Touch 1/4 away from similarly "owning" all 6 right-facing column arrangements, or a Pass Thru/Wheel and Deal away from all 6 Double Pass Thru arrangements, and so on.

Student callers are urged to first study the 6 line arrangements using checkers or square dance dolls and then they should practice actually setting them up with real dancers. They will obviously also need to study how to bring each of the line arrangements back to some normal

arrangement.

Here are some easy-to-remember arrangement conversions:

- 1. Any Facing Lines arrangement plus Touch 1/4 will produce a corresponding Columns arrangement (right-facing columns)
- 2. Any facing lines arrangement plus Pass Thru/Wheel & Deal will produce a corresponding Double Pass Thru arrangement
- 3. Any Facing Lines arrangement plus Pass Thru/Wheel & Deal/Centers Pass Thru will produce a corresponding 8-Chain Thru arrangement
- 4. Any facing Lines arrangement plus Pass Thru/Wheel & Deal/centers Pass Thru/Swing Thru Centers Run will produce a corresponsing 2-Faced Line arrangement (right-facing)
- 5. From a Zero/Normal ocean wave, a Swing Thru produces a 1/2 Wave (and vice versa)
- 6. From any wave that is NOT zero or 1/2 Sashayed, a Swing Thru (called once, twice, three times or four times as necessary) will produce any of the other four symmetric wave arrangements.

WHAT'S HAPPENING?

There are two bits of information this month from Callerlab's QS Committees: First, the Advanced QS Committee has chosen "Harmonize" (see page 1636 in this issue and page 1582 in the issue of last July) as the QS move for the Advanced Program for the quarter beginning Dec. 1, 1984. The Mainstream QS Committee has announced that it's

members have voted for no new movements to be featured for the quarter beginning Jan. 1st, 1985.

We also received some mail this month in response to our comments in last month's issue about the who's-your-partner-in-an-ocean-wave question. There wasn't very much mail on the subject -which makes me wonder whether the subject may really be a great big non-issue -- and what there was either agreed with our compromise suggestion or recommended that the subject be dropped altogether since it didn't seem to pose any real problems for the average caller or dancer. Interesting!

Here's the new material we looked at this month:

BREW UP (Johnny Hayes, England) From a 1/4 Line formation (2-faced line between facing pairs, as in 1-3 Star Thru, Veer Left) all walk ahead and, Veering left form momentary parallel 2-faced lines. Without stopping centers Trade and all then Cast 3/4. Johnny touts this call as "England's answer to Percolate" and says it can also be fractionalized, i.e., 1/3, 2/3, etc.

What's Happening? (continued)

IN/OUT ROLL TO A WAVE (Norm Poisson)
From diamonds, designated point (infacing point for "Inroll to a Wave" and outfacing point for "Outroll to a Wave" Circulates as the other point does a turn-step-turn toward the Circulating point — which is to say that both point move as in In or Out Roll Circulate. Simultaneously, the center dancer who is facing the Circulating (designated) point will step ahead taking the other center along to Hinge in the spot vacated by the Circulator. The action ends in parallel ocean waves.

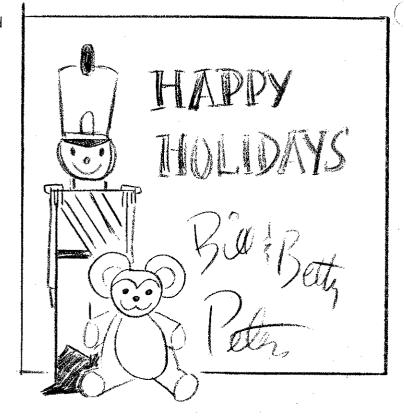
ROLL THRU TO A DIAMOND (Jack Berg)
From a Trade By or 3/4 Tag formation, centers
Turn Thru as outsides do a (right face) turn back
plus Pass Thru. Without stopping, centers now
Touch as outsides 1/4 right to end the action
in twin diamonds.

ROMANCE THE STONE (Jack Berg) From a diamond, all (Box) Counter Rotate the Diamond (like a diamond Circulate except that the centers remain centers and the points remain points). All now Cut the Diamond and the new centers turn back and all do an Ah So.

SPIN RIGHT/LEFT TO A DIAMOND (Bob Elling) From any formation having facing centers and identifiable outsides (such as 1/4 or 3/4 Tag), centers Spin the Top as the outsides take the facing direction and do a single file Promenade around the outside 1/4 (Counter Rotate). The name has been used before (Burleson 2700),

SPLIT THE OCEAN/SEA (Right/Left, etc.)
From facing lines, the centers Pass the Ocean or Pass the Sea (as designated) as the ends do a Pass Thru and take the facing command (in out, right, left, etc.). The name has been used before (see Burleson 2092)

TEAPARTY PROMENADE A novelty routine recommended for use with newer/beginning dancers. The action starts with Head couples doing a Promenade 1/2 wayaround the outside and then all 4 girls step into the center to stand back-to-back and facing out. The 4 boys then Promenade counter-clockwise full around the set to the same girl and turn her left into a Roll Promenade and all 4 couples then Promenade 1/2 way around the set. This action is then repeated three more times. Heads lead the action the first two times and the Sides initiate the action the second two times.



NEW MOVEMENT

SPIN THE NET (Don Beck)

How To Do It:

From parallel ocean waves, all Spin the Top to form a momentary Tidal Wave and, without stopping the center four dancers Spin the Top again. Simultaneously, the other four dancers Cast Off 3/4 and then those facing out will Run to end the action in a 1/4 Tag formation. When called from 1/2 Sashayed ocean waves, the action ends in a normal (zero) 1/4 Tag Formation, and vice versa.

Impressions:

Don may have come up with another winner with this one. It is a real smoothie and our dancers responded with unanimous enthusiasm. While it might appear that the dancers who must do the final Cast Off + Run are going to be subjected a degree of overflow, it didn't seem to pose any problems for our dancers -- we asked 'em about it and it hadn't occurred to them that there was more flow than they could comfortably handle. Don tells me he asked the same wuestion -- and got the same answers.

NEW ADVANCED QS MOVEMENT

HARMONIZE

The new Callerlab QS move for the Advanced Program is George Amos' "Harmonize". We introduced the move back in our July 1984 issue (see page 1582), so you might want to review it again. It is interesting to note that while the author's definition compared the final move-up action to a n identical action in Coordinate (a Plus Program call), the definition in the Callerlab press release compares the same action to an Hourglass Circulate.

Here is the Callerlab definition plus some additional routines using Advanced Program material:

Harmonize: From parallel lines or waves with centers in a mini-wave: Centers 1/2 Circulate as ends Flip to the nearest center, do a Triple Trade, very centers and lonesome ends move up as in Hourglass Circulate. Right-hand 2-faced lines end in right-hand ocean waves and vice versa; left-hand 2-faced lines end in left-hand ocean waves and vice versa.

We have recently received copies of another fine Australian note service. This one is called "Callerlink" and it is published by the Australian Caller's Federation.

The current issue of Callerlink describes a gimmick or novelty idea called "Guillotine" which we suspect might be amusing if it used no more than once or twice. The idea comes from Keith Lethbridge -- a fine caller and choreographer from Western Australia -- and Keith capitalizes on an old square dance joke by defining the term "Guillotine" to mean "Heads Rollaway!". When you have described that definition to your dancers (and it might also be a good idea to caution them to remember who are Heads and who are Sides), then you could call the following routines:

SIGHT CALLER'S NOTE BOOK

A SIGHT CALLER'S RESPONSIBILITY

While a student sight caller is generally able to find a lot of printed training material that deals with the mechanics of sight calling and with its various "how-to-do-it" aspects, he or she will also have a hard time finding any material at all that deals with what we have come to recognize as the responsibility of a sight caller. This monthly feature of CHOREO BREAK-DOWN is a good case in point. We have, for years now, devoted a considerable amount of space to a wide range of step-by-step sight calling instructions (the "science" of sight calling) but we have also written next to nothing at all on its programming aspects (the "art" of sight calling).

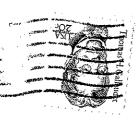
It is no secret that we have, for some time now, regularly urged our readers to learn and use not only the skills we associate with sight resolution, but with the equally important skills of Formation Awareness and Formation Management as well. We have consistently portrayed both techniques as the required elements of every sight caller's essential craft and a modern caller simply cannot claim to be a sight caller unless he is the master of them both. We have, in addition, also noted that while the ability to resolve the square accurately is, as a rule, fairly easy to achieve, the skills of Formation Awareness and Formation Management usually require a bit more practice and they certainly take a lot more time to acquire. They're not all that difficult to learn — they simply take an awful, lot of on-mike experience before a caller is able to successfully improvise his way — gliby and easily — through all of the famations and arrangements that his new-found ability to "freewheel" may take him.

It is nevertheless also true that most student sight callers do eventually learn these skills and they are then able to enjoy the obvious benefits that accrue to any caller who regularly uses sight calling as his primary calling method. That, however, is also the time — when a sight caller is finally able to manipulate his dancers through all of the formations and arrangements that his programs may now require — when a sight caller must contend with what may well be an even more critical question, i.e., how much of his hard-earned skills should he actually use during a given dance? Just because he is able to to easily establish six different facing line arrangements, should he therefore call a Load the Boat from all of them? And just because he now has no problems in setting up six different ocean wave arrangements, does that make it desirable to call a Recycle from each one? We obviously do not think so — and this is what we mean by the "Responsibility" of a sight caller.

While it is absolutely essential for every sight caller to possess the ability to move his dancers through all of the formations and arrangements that are, in effect, built into his personal repertoire, it is equally important for him to also know when a given move in a given formation/arrangement will cause a floor to break down. This is not to say that a sight caller should not eventually train his dancers to comfortably handle six different Load the Boats or six different Recycles, for that would obviously be aplus for both caller and dancer — but rather that it is the responsibility of every sight caller to know — before he calls a move from a particular formation/arrangement — whether a given group of dancers actually has the training and experience to dance the action of a call from all of it's allowable arrangements and, if not, which arrangements will they find easy

and which will they regard as being difficult. This, of course, represents the perennial programming question that confronts every caller, sight caller or otherwise. No caller can effectively avoid it and we are, in fact, certain that each of you already deal with thequestion — in one way or another — every time you raise your microphone. We're sure that you all know, for example, that a Load the Boat called from any arrangement other than normal (zero) facing lines of four will, for most groups, cause a considerable and predictable degree of dancer breakdown, and that a Recycle called from anything other than normal ocean waves will similarly cause measurable dancer fallout — and what's even most important, we're just as sure that most of you will therefore decide to teach or workshop the actions of such calls — before you actually call them from arrangements that you know will cause problems — if it is your considered judgment that your dancers will enjoy and/or benefit from such APD or DBD programming. You are, in other words, aware of your responsibility as a sight caller and you are acting accordingly.

A sight caller should, to be sure, be able to put the dancers through whatever APD programming he feels they will enjoy. But each group he calls for is different — and even the same group will be different from one night to the next, and the degree of APD that appeals to one group will be different from the degree that appeals to another. This means that a sight caller needs to be able to (1), find the precise degree of APD that does appeal to them (art), and (2), be able to provide it while calling extemporaneously (the science).
