PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE...

The Square Dance Foundation of New England, Inc. enjoyed many accomplishments in Yr. 2015. What's most important about that year is the sweeping change in how vital square, round, and folk dance history is being preserved by the SDFNE. We would like to clear up some of the confusion about our actions, and leave you with a better picture of the SDFNE's Mission you are supporting,

Preservation – Promotion – Perpetuation.
In order to bring to fruition Charlie & Bertha Baldwin's vision of preserving square dance history, the SDFNE Officers and Board of Directors had been searching for an educational institution that valued the art of dance. We found that institution, The University of New Hampshire, in Durham, NH. A decade ago, historical dance collections from the SDFNE's Research Library were donated to UNH's Library for their Milne Special Collections Library which houses what is probably the largest collection of square dance related materials anywhere in the world. As the SDFNE's Research Library closed, UNH took a huge amount of books, documents, recordings, photographs, and other items.

The task of organizing and cataloging this material will take years. On September 29, 2015, the SDFNE made a contribution of \$5,000.00 to help the University's work on this

task. As everyone knows, libraries and museums are constantly in need of financial support. In 2009, the SDFNE donated twenty-four square dance costumes to the University of New Hampshire's Museum.

Many of the books and records that we have donated have already been cataloged and are listed on the UNH web site. To search for books use the web address:

HALL OF FAME AWARD



On August 01, 2015, Charlie & Paula Trapp were inducted into the Square Dance Foundation of New England's Hall of Fame. In 1966, Charlie began round dance lessons with Don & Hope Sargent and square dance lessons with Jack Bright. And two years later in 1968 started Calling. Over the years he has taught classes at Happy Squares, The Waltham Twirlers, Ramblin Hoedowners, Nauset Squares, Nautical Twirlers, Kramers Hayloft, Fan-C-Squares and many other clubs. He was always available to call for benefit dances, including the Yearling Dance, the Teen Carnival, SEMCA, and the SDFNE.

Charlie has attended a number of Caller Schools and learned from the best: Skip Smith, Kip Garvey, Earl Johnston, Al Brundage, Jack Larsy, Jim Mayo, Ron Schnider, and others. He continued his Caller education with Clinics by Clint McLean, Vaughn Parrish, Ed Foote, Bob Gambell, Dick Jones, Elmer Shefield and many others. All of this education resulted in Charlie's twenty-nine successful Square Dance Weekends at East Hill Farm, Troy, NH.

In 1968, Charlie joined the Old Colony Callers Assoc. and served the organization as President, Vice Pres., NECCA delegate, and Education Chairman. At every OCCA meeting, training of callers is included. Since 1979, Charlie became a Callerlab member and has served on the Callerlab Advanced Selection Committee ever since. He has Called at every New England Convention since 1972, every SEMCA dance but one since 1970, and called at the 1977 and 2015 National Square Dance Conventions

Through all of these events, Paul has been at his side. They were married at a square dance 43 years ago. Fourteen squares were in attendance with Red Bates calling. Their marriage to each other and to square dancing is an inspiration to all of us. Charlie & Paula have dedicated themselves to the Preservation, Promotion and Perpetuation of Square and Round Dancing in New England. We applaud their generosity and talent.

Local Legend Award

Colleen Irish fits right into that special group of people who give their all for what they believe in. In 1993, Colleen and her husband, Gene, graduated from not one, but two square dance classes. After graduating, Colleen was elected Club Treasurer and served in that position for four years. She went on to become Club President and served until the early 2000's when Gene became ill. During the difficult time of taking care of Gene, Colleen developed a club newspaper. The Scoop, and is still compiling and printing it today.

After her husband's passing, Colleen went on to serve 3 terms as Club President; 5 terms as Dance Program Chmn. 3 additional terms as Club President and 4 years as Club Secretary.

This means Colleen has been promoting, preserving, and perpetuating square dancing for at least 22 years.

In 2008, she recognized a need to centralize the dance schedules of all Maine Clubs. She contacted all Maine Club Presidents and arranged a meeting. Out of that meeting in 2009, with Colleen's leadership, the Maine Federation of Square Dance Clubs was formed. She has served as the fracilitator of this group ever since.

The Square Dance Community is extremely fortunate to have couples and individuals, like Colleen, who give so generously of their time and talents to support and perpetuate the legacy of square and round dancing in New England. We extend our appreciation and gratitude.
