Switzerland Travel Fundraiser Leads to Great Heights!

All the New England Travelers enjoyed breathtaking views from the Glacier Express Train that took them past roaring waterfalls and glacial ice fields. The train crossed 291 bridges and passed through 91 tunnels. It was an amazing ride. Another highlight of the trip was staying in Zermatt for 2 days. The village is surrounded by a dozen peaks over 13,000 feet high, and is situated beneath the famous Matterhorn. Weather was perfect the day the group ascended to the top of the Klein Matterhorn. What an awe-inspiring view!

During the trip, the travelers had the opportunity to have their Passports stamped in the Principality of Liechtenstein, a tiny alpine country famous for its postage stamps. From there they traveled int9 the heart of the Swiss Alps, where they saw deep blue lakes with white swans swimming near the shores, huge snow-capped mountains, and quaint chalets.


